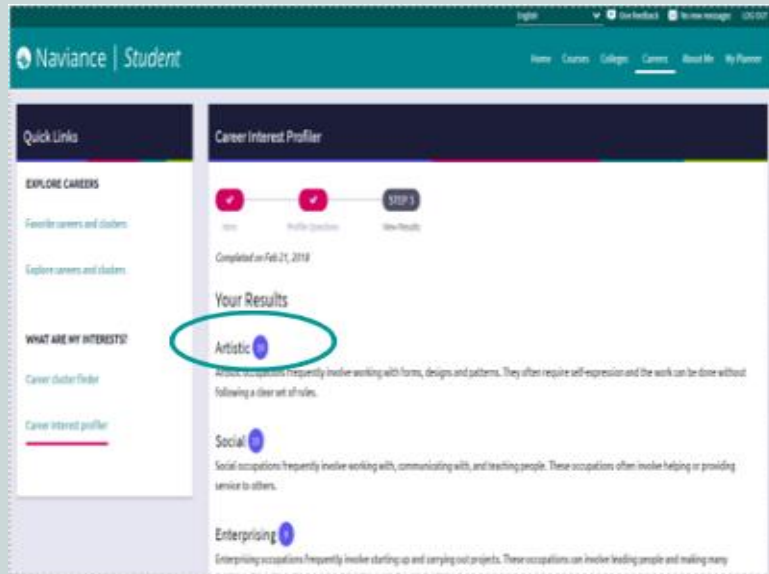

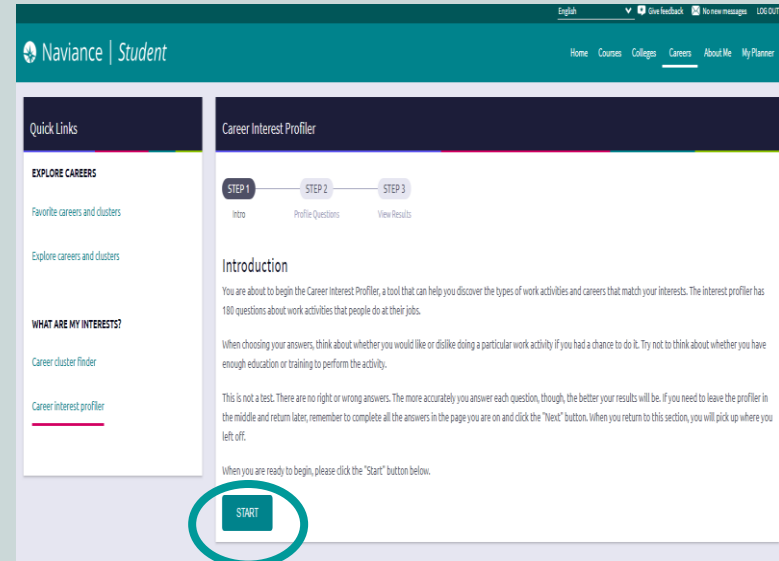

Artistic occupations frequently involve working with forms, designs, or objects, often by hand or by computer. They often require a high degree of creativity, originality, and artistic talent. They may be done without following a clear set of rules.

**Social** 15

Social occupations frequently involve working with, communicating with, or providing service to others. They may require a high degree of interpersonal skills.

**Enterprising** 9

Enterprising occupations frequently involve starting up and carrying out business. They often require a high degree of initiative, leadership, and risk-taking.

# Career Interest Profiler Categories

**Realistic:** Realistic occupations frequently involve activities including practical, hands-on problems and solutions. They often deal with plants, animals, and real-world materials like wood, tools, and machinery. Many of the occupations require working outside, and do not involve a lot of paperwork or working closely with others.

**Investigative:** Investigative occupations frequently involve working with ideas, and require an extensive amount of thinking. These occupations can involve searching for facts and figuring out problems mentally.

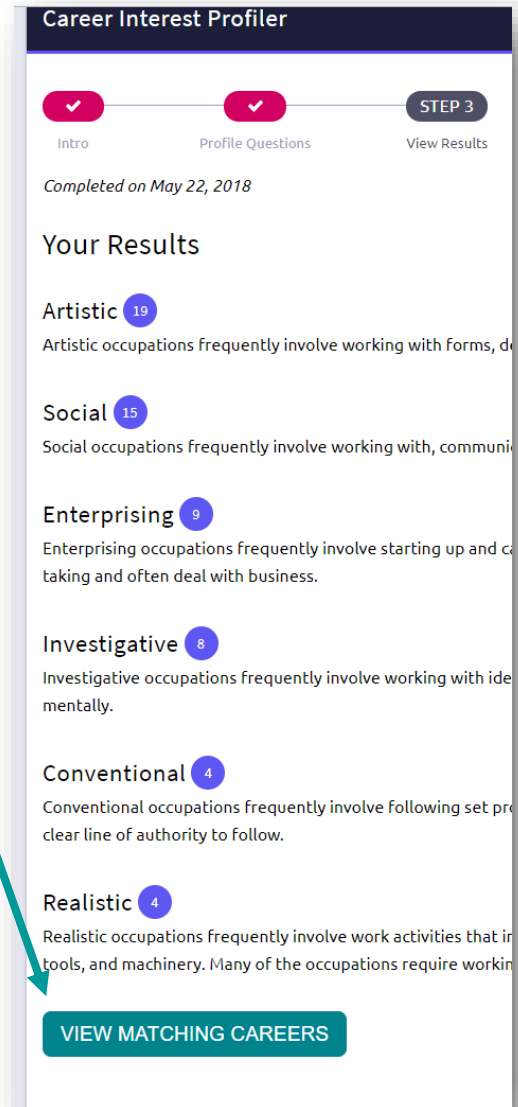
**Artistic:** Artistic occupations frequently involve working with forms, designs and patterns. They often require self-expression and the work can be done without following a clear set of rules.

**Social:** Social occupations frequently involve working with, communicating with, and teaching people. These occupations often involve helping or providing service to others.

**Enterprising:** Enterprising occupations frequently involve starting up and carrying out projects. These occupations can involve leading people and making many decisions. Sometimes they require risk taking and often deal with business.

# Career Job Zone: **Some Preparation**

## **Overall Experience**

Some previous work-related skill, knowledge, or experience may be helpful in these occupations, but usually is not needed.

## **Education**

These occupations usually require a high school diploma and may require some vocational training or job-related course work. In some cases, an associate's or bachelor's degree could be needed.

## **Job Training**

Employees in these occupations need anywhere from a few months to one year of working with experienced employees.

## **Examples**

These occupations often involve using your knowledge and skills to help others. *Examples include sheet metal workers, forest fire fighters, customer service representatives, pharmacy technicians, salespersons (retail), and bank tellers*

# Career Job Zone: **Medium Preparation**

## **Overall Experience**

Previous work-related skill, knowledge, or experience is required for these occupations. For example, an electrician must have completed three or four years of apprenticeship or several years of vocational training, and often must have passed a licensing exam, in order to perform the job.

## **Education**

Most occupations in this zone require training in vocational/technical schools, related on-the-job experience, or an associate's degree. Some may require a bachelor's degree.

## **Job Training**

Employees in these occupations usually need one or two years of training involving both on-the-job experience and informal training with experienced workers.

## **Examples**

These occupations usually involve using communication and organizational skills to coordinate, supervise, manage, or train others to accomplish goals. *Examples include funeral directors, electricians, forest and conservation technicians, legal secretaries, interviewers, and insurance sales agents.*

# Career Job Zone: **Considerable Preparation**

## **Overall Experience**

A minimum of two to four years of work-related skill, knowledge, or experience is needed for these occupations. For example, an accountant must complete four years of college and work for several years in accounting to be considered qualified.

## **Education**

Most of these occupations require a four - year bachelor's degree, but some do not.

## **Job Training**

Employees in these occupations usually need several years of work-related experience, on-the-job training, and/or vocational/technical training.

## **Examples**

Many of these occupations involve coordinating, supervising, managing, or training others. *Examples include accountants, human resource managers, computer programmers, teachers, chemists, and police detectives.*



# Career Job Zone: **Extensive Preparation**

## **Overall Experience**

Extensive skill, knowledge, and experience are needed for these occupations. Many require more than five years of experience. For example, surgeons must complete four years of college and an additional five to seven years of specialized medical training to be able to do their job.

## **Education**

A bachelor's degree is the minimum formal education required for these occupations. However, many also require graduate school. For example, they may require a master's degree, and some require a Ph.D., M.D., or J.D. (law degree).

## **Job Training**

Employees may need some on-the-job training, but most of these occupations assume that the person will already have the required skills, knowledge, work-related experience, and/or training.

## **Examples**

These occupations often involve coordinating, training, supervising, or managing the activities of others to accomplish goals. Very advanced communication and organizational skills are required. *Examples include librarians, lawyers, aerospace engineers, physicists, school psychologists, and surgeons.*

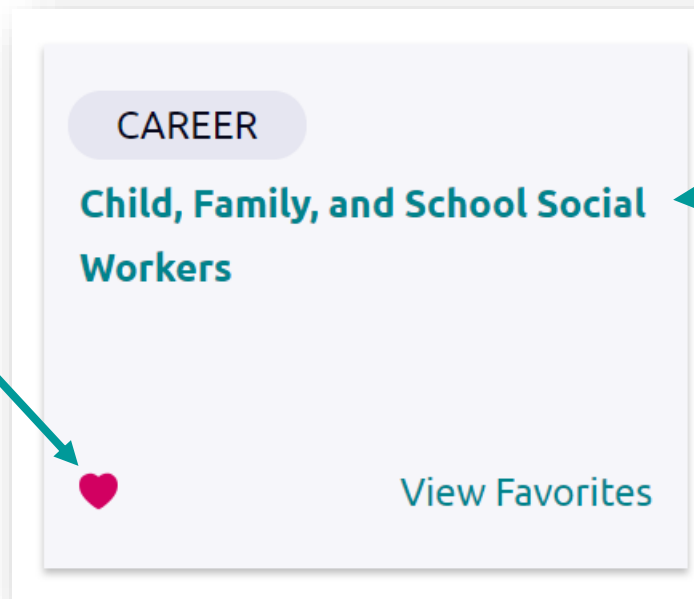

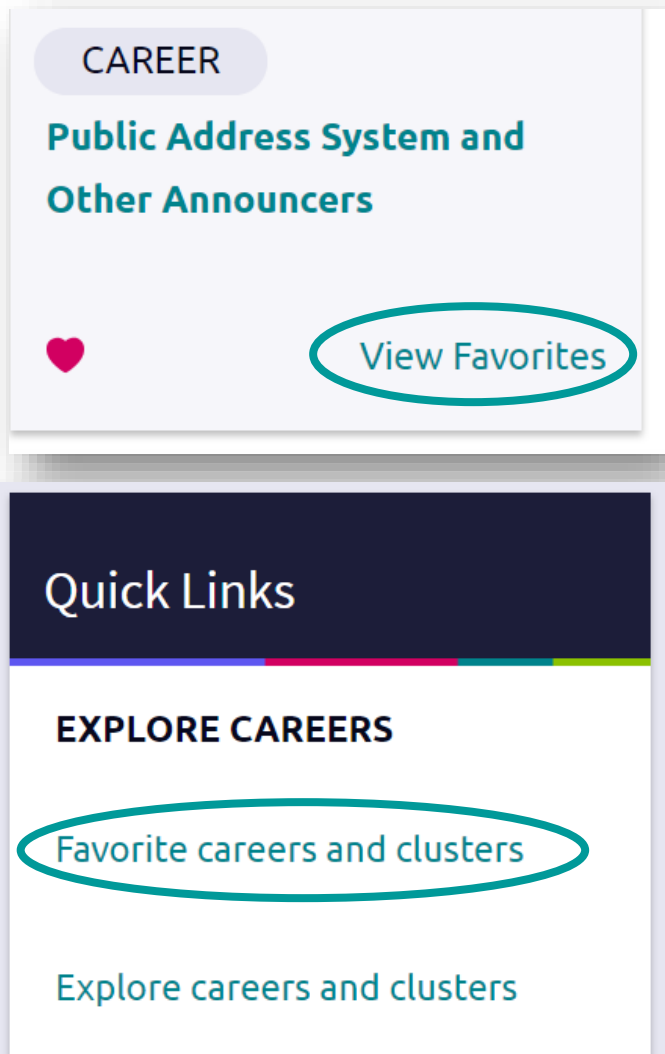
