District seeks high school boundary change feedback

District community committee presenting potential changes in community forums

On July 3, 2018, the board of directors directed the district to <u>form a committee</u> to help reduce enrollment at Jackson High School. The community committee is developing a recommendation to the board of directors on potential new boundaries in order to reduce enrollment at Jackson High School beginning fall 2020. Jackson High School is currently about 375 students over capacity, and that number grows annually.

Potential boundary changes would affect all three comprehensive high schools, moving some current Jackson students to Cascade High and some current Cascade students to Everett High. The committee has developed two proposed boundary maps and is holding community forums to gather comments and concerns.

Everett Public Schools would like your input on proposed new high school boundaries. Please attend one of the forums and share your thoughts:

- Wednesday, Feb. 6, Gateway Middle School cafeteria, 6 7:30 p.m.
- Thursday, Feb. 7, Cascade High School cafeteria, 6 7:30 p.m.
