The workforce in Snohomish County is steeped in innovation

We have the state's highest concentration of manufacturing: 25 percent of the county workforce. Further, our county has the highest concentration of engineers in the state, working across multiple industries. Affordable housing and a desirable location and quality of life continue to attract a workforce that has grown by 20 percent over the past decade.



Nationally, Washington ranks **second in the nation** in concentration of STEM jobs.



The Snohomish County workforce has grown by 20% over the past decade and continues to increase.



In 2017, **62% of Washington voters had heard of STEM,** almost double the percentage in 2013 (32%).



The U.S. will have 9 million **STEM related job openings** by 2022.
