## **INSTRUCTION**

## **Co-Curricular Program**

Appropriate co-curricular activities that contribute to the athletic, intellectual, social, emotional, and physical development of students will be provided. All athletic or co-curricular activity programs shall be conducted in compliance with Washington State law and regulations of the State Board of Education, the Washington Interscholastic Activities Association, and the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

Any activity conducted under the name of a school or subdivision of the school (e.g., classroom, class) will have the approval of the school principal.

<u>The</u> <u>Ss</u>afety and wellbeing of students is a primary concern and shall guide all district staff in the conduct of any student activity.

The board does not allow any secret organizations. All co-curricular activities shall be open to any eligible student regardless of race, ethnicity, gender, socioeconomic status, creed, or handicapping condition. The board district will not exclude any person from participation in the co-curricular program, deny any person the benefits of such a program or otherwise discriminate against any person in any co-curricular program on the basis of the categories identified in the district's nondiscrimination policy.

## The criteria to be used by the principal for approving curriculum-related activities are:

- A. The purposes and/or objectives will be part of a specific program or course offering;
- B. The participating students will be currently enrolled in a related course or program or possess the entry level knowledge and/or skills to successfully participate in the activity;
- C. The group will be supervised by a qualified staff member;
- D. The cost of the activity must not be prohibitive to student or district;
- E. The cost of the activity must comply with the Title IX requirements;
- F. All activity must take place on school premises unless approved in advance by the school principal; and
- G. The activity must not be secretive in nature.

<u>Curriculum related activities, whether approved by the board as part of the ASB or by the principal, must meet at least one (1) of the following criteria:</u>

- A. The subject matter of the activity is actually taught or will soon be taught in a regularly offered course;
- B. The subject matter of the activity concerns the body of courses as a whole;
- C. Participation in the activity is required for a particular course; or
- D. Participation in the activity results in academic credit.

The superintendent or designee shall develop procedures for planning, funding, approval, evaluation and implementation of <u>all</u> student co-curricular activities <u>offered within the above guidelines</u>.

The principal will be responsible for administering the co-curricular program in the school. An opportunity will be made available in each school for students, including those with disabilities, to participate in some aspect of the program. A survey will be conducted at least once every three (3) years to assure that the recreational and athletic activities program accurately responds to the needs and desires of both male and female students.

The district will evaluate its intramural and interscholastic program at least once each year to ensure that equal opportunities are available to members of both sexes with respect to participation in interscholastic and/or intramural programs.
