Overview of Services

Cocoon House empowers young people, families and the community to break the cycle of homelessness through outreach, housing and prevention.

Emergency Housing Services

- Safe Place: Our 24/7 housing crisis line

- Emergency housing for 12-17 year olds
 - We have two locations:
 - Everett – 2726 Cedar St. 425-259-6042
 - and Monroe – 15302 Plainview Pl. 360-805-9282
 - We have 4 HOPE beds that are open to state dependent youth.
 - We offer a variety of services varying from case management, MH/DA, employment, education, housing, legal support, medical support.
 - Focus is on family reconciliation when available and appropriate.



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Housing Services

- Long term housing
 - We have two locations:
 - Transitions, 3530 Colby Ave. Everett 425-259-5802 x101
 - Youth ages 15-18
 - North, 521 E Highland Dr. Arlington 425-259-5802 x202
 - Maternity Group Home ages 12-17
- We offer a variety of services varying from case management, MH/DA, employment, education, housing, legal support, medical support.
- 5 MGH beds, 15 TLP beds, 7 RLSP beds
- Journeys – 3530 Colby Ave. Everett
 - 20 leased studios for 18-24 year olds
 - Case management available but services are voluntary
 - Anticipated lease up in August 2019
 - Units will be filled through Coordinated Entry



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Outreach Services

- **Advocates**
 - Available to any youth, **age range 12-24**
 - Assistance offered includes, but is not limited to:
 - Documentation, employment, education, housing, legal support, medical support, mental health support
 - Provide mobile case management (“meet them where they’re at”)
 - Will partner with schools and other agencies as needed and at agency’s convenience
 - Services for CSEC, including case management, prevention, outreach

Outreach Services

- **U-Turn Drop-In Center (3530 Colby Ave, Everett, WA)**
 - Youth drop-in center, open 7 days a week; Monday to Friday 2 PM to 6:30 PM, Saturday and Sunday 10:00 to 1:00 PM
 - Case manager on site each weekday – “Advocate of the Day”
 - Showers, laundry, computers, Wi-Fi, hot meal at 4:30 (or at 10:00 AM on Saturday and Sunday)
 - Access to recording studio
 - Partnerships include a once-monthly legal clinic with CCYJ, weekly visits from a nurse with CHC and drug and alcohol counselor with CCS

Outreach Services

- **Young Adult Coordinated Entry (CE) Navigators**
 - Housing assistance for **18-24 year olds**, including:
 - Entry into HMIS, the county-wide housing pool
 - Eligibility for Rapid Rehousing
 - Placement on Friends of Youth and Housing Hope waitlists
 - Potential rental assistance, homelessness prevention
 - Mobile services available

Prevention Services

- **Prevention** for parents and families. Call 425.877.5171
 - Family Case Management – will work with youth and their families to resolve conflicts and eliminate barriers to stability
 - WayOUT – monthly two-day seminars for parents and their children to discuss issues leading to conflict in the home
 - Parenting classes – offered throughout Snohomish County on topics relevant to parents of at-risk teens, including internet safety, substance abuse, depression
 - One-on-one consultations with parents – including option for parents to call in for up to 90 minute phone calls

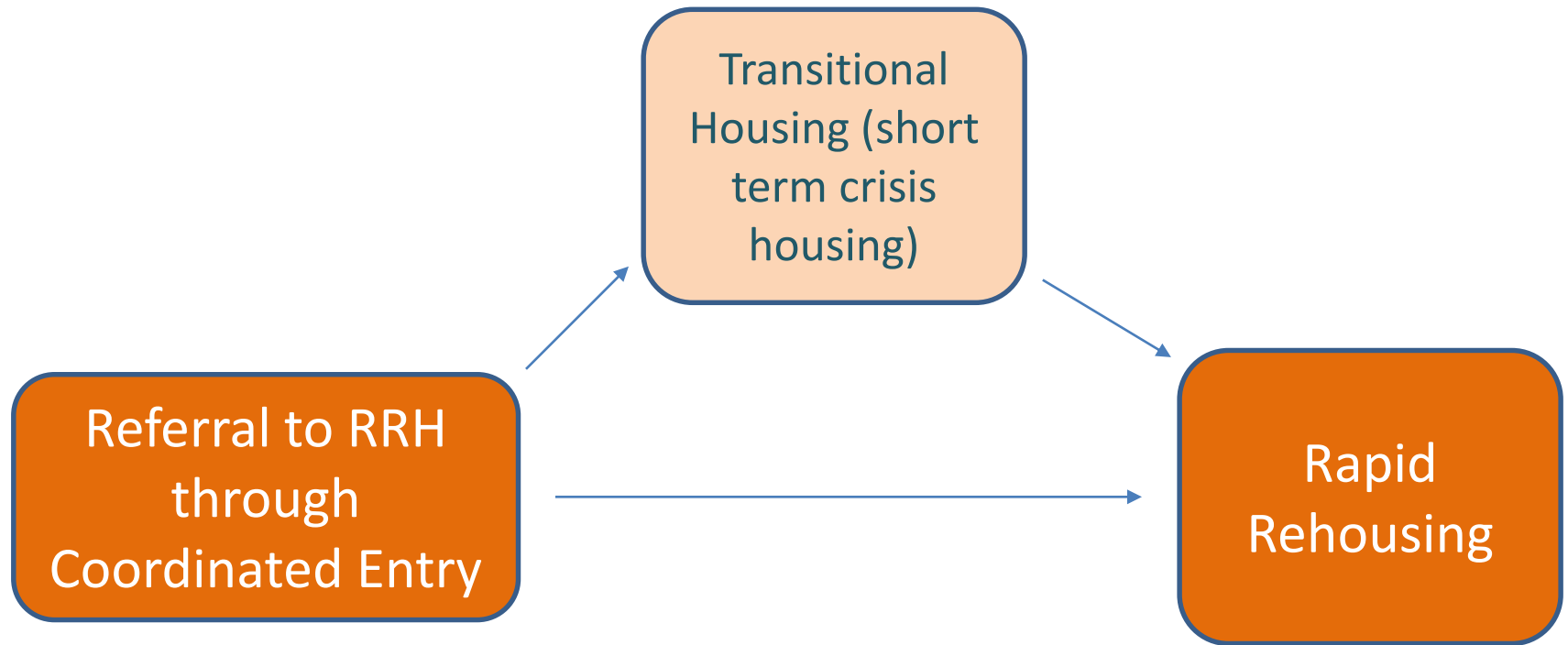
The Future...

- **Transitional Housing/Rapid Rehousing - YHDP**
 - 18-24 year olds (includes parents that are 18-24)
 - Immediate TH option until RRH unit available
 - Rapid Rehousing – light subsidy and services



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Transitional Housing – Rapid Rehousing



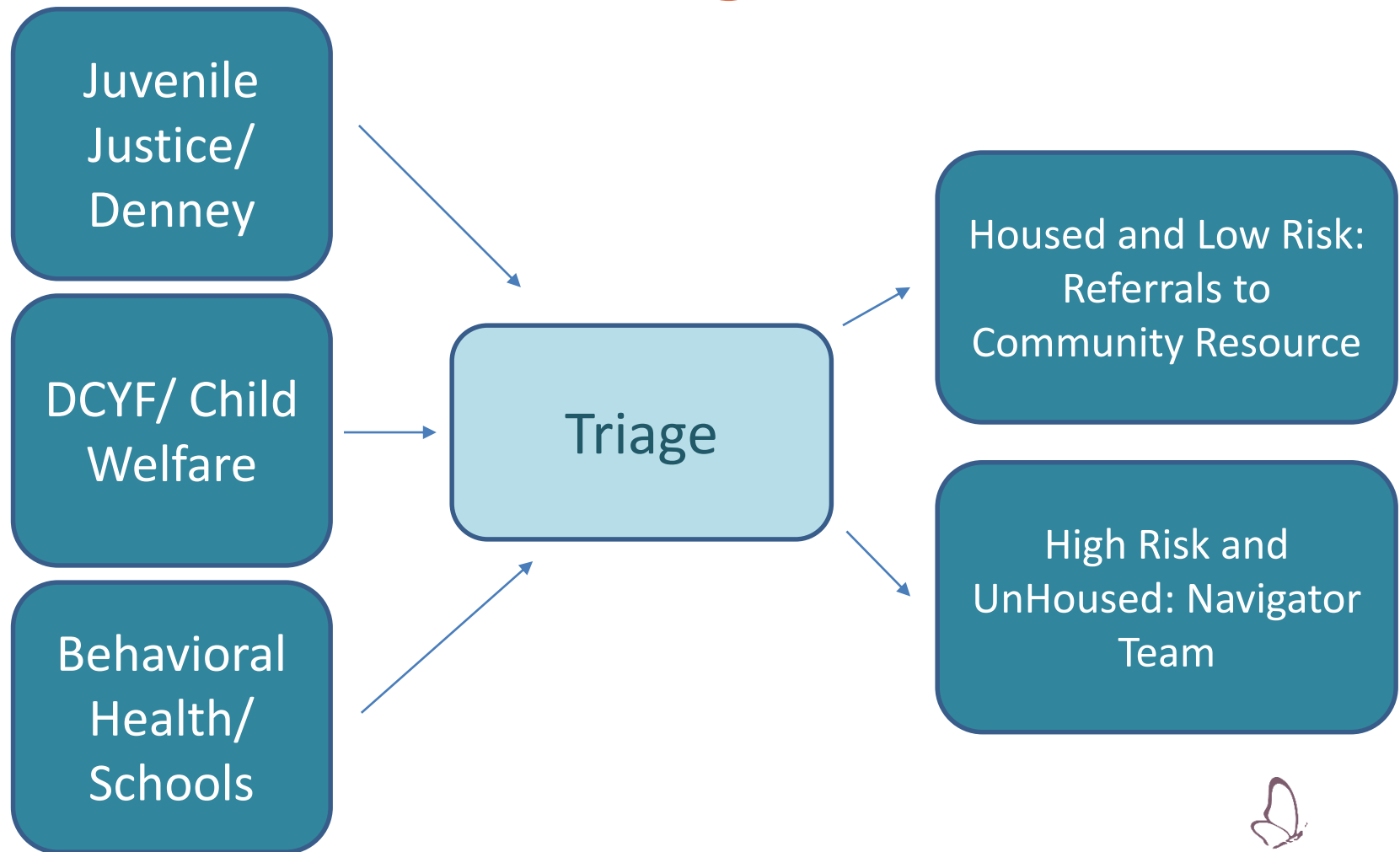
The Future...

- **Youth Navigator Team - YHDP**
 - Geared to youth under 18 that are homeless or at risk of homelessness
 - Assessment at system entry points
 - Collaboration with:
 - DCYF
 - Juvenile Justice/Denney
 - Schools and Behavioral Health
 - Other community partners

Youth Navigator Team and YOU!

- **Data Flags:**
 - Are there flags already in your system?
 - Do these flags screen for HUD homeless criteria?
- **Screening Tool:**
 - 5 questions to determine housing vulnerability
- **Referrals:**
 - When/Where/Who will screen and refer?

Service Continuum Mapping

- No Risk – Case Closed
- Low Risk
 - Telehealth support services
 - Phone consultations
 - Parent coaching
- Moderate Risk
 - Selective prevention programs
 - Strengthening Families
 - Guiding Good Choices

Service Continuum Mapping

- High Risk
 - In home interventions
 - Family Functional Therapy
 - Multidisciplinary wraparound teams
- Currently Unhoused
 - McKinney Vento services
 - Foster care services
 - Coordinated care through local shelters
 - Civil legal services



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
