Dear Parents,

Welcome to November! I can hardly believe that November is already here; however, the weather does seem to remind us that winter is upon us. The time has flown by, and I am pleased with the amount of work and progress we have accomplished in the first two months of school.

Parent-teacher conferences are scheduled for October 31 – November 4. During this week, Woodside will be on an Early Dismissal schedule, dismissing students at 12:20 – lunches will be served. Parent-teacher conferences are a very valuable opportunity for you to discuss the academic and social growth of your child. We look forward to seeing you at these upcoming conference meetings.

Student success and improving student achievement are a priority at Woodside. We are focused on instruction that supports grade level standards and engages students in the learning process. Instruction is being structured where students do the thinking, their voice is elevated, and the students are supported and empowered. The goal of all literacy instruction is to foster proficiency, confidence, and a love for reading and writing. Reading instruction is guided by grade level expectations as defined in the standards. Assessment practices are ongoing, and the data is used to inform instruction. A gradual release of responsibility is an undergirding principle of teaching and learning. Lessons are intentionally planned and include knowledge of students, learning targets, academic vocabulary, instructional outcomes (academic and social-emotional learning), knowledge of resources, a sequenced instructional design, and aligned formative assessment practices.

In the area of math instruction, we are in our second year of implementing the district adopted Illustrative Mathematics Program (IM) in grades K-12. Our goal is to have an aligned system throughout the school district for all students. The goal is to ensure all students have a consistent math experience, no matter what classroom or grade they are in. Teachers consistently use a Launch – Work– Synthesis model across grade levels. The use of math language routines engages students in math learning; and the program includes IM centers, which provide additional practice and develops students' procedural fluency.

Classroom science instruction in grades K-5 takes place up to 120 minutes a week, using our current science curriculum. All Woodside students are scheduled for additional STEM instruction

weekly, in our school Innovation Lab. All instruction aligns with Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS).

Student success and improving student achievement are a priority at Woodside. Two of the most essential questions we can ask ourselves are “What does success look and feel like for students?” and “How can we best help each child reach that potential?” These questions highlight our moral obligation as teachers—this is the essence of what we do at Woodside.

As we enter into the holiday season, I continue to be thankful to be the principal of a school that cares deeply about the success of students—ALL students. Our work is hard, emotional, and passionate; and there is no other work that is more important.

Dear Woodside Families,

We had our first S.O.A.R. kick-off assembly of the year for all grades K, 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 where Woodside students re-learned expectations and November's theme of S is for Safety. At the start of the year, paraeducators led classroom rodeos with teachers, to teach students S.O.A.R. expectations on the playground at recess, on the bus, and walking through common areas of the school. Family partnerships are an important part of student learning and success. The matrix below describes S.O.A.R. expectations in all areas of the school. Parents can review, familiarize yourselves and discuss the S.O.A.R. matrix with your student at home. This practice of families working together with the school to support S.O.A.R. expectations, ensures all students gain a social, emotional skillset that prepares them for a future of success in school and beyond. Each month our schoolwide focus will be on one letter in S.O.A.R. and students will have the opportunity to collect S.O.A.R. tickets towards our school goal for a monthly school incentive. At Woodside, we use the acronym S.O.A.R. to teach behavior expectations.

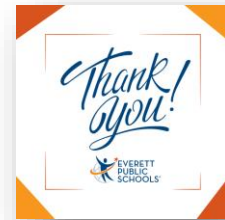

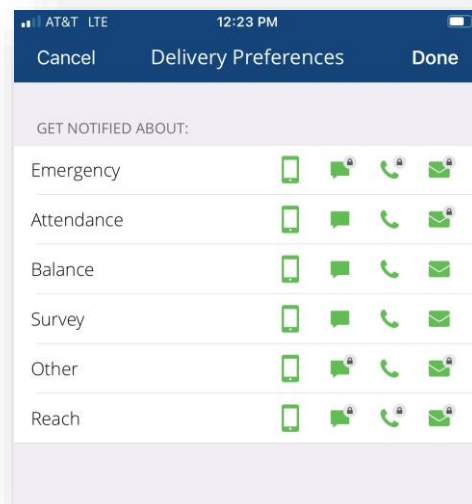

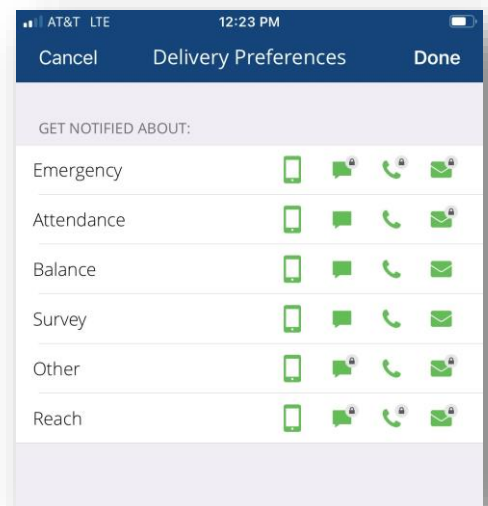
