Passport to Careers - Overview

A scholarship available to help remove barriers and provide resources for people interested in exploring career paths (Passport to Apprenticeship) and college (Passport to College).

Eligibility Criteria:

1. Must have been in out-of-home foster care after age 14, **OR** homeless currently or within the last academic year **OR** be eligible to receive the Federal Pell/State Need Grant
2. Are enrolled (or will enroll) at least half-time in a registered [pre-apprenticeship](#) or [apprenticeship program](#) by your 21st birthday
3. Maintain Washington residency

Why is this grant important?

- Aging out crisis
- Equity
- Youth and young adults (14-26) experiencing foster care and homelessness typically face more barriers
- Our goal is to provide more resources for youth and young adults
- Get people into family living wage jobs
- Provides immediate assistance
- Career planning and planning for the future
- We want teens and young adults to know ALL of their options as they decide what they want to do next

Passport to College

For people who are 100% sure they want to go to college.

For example...

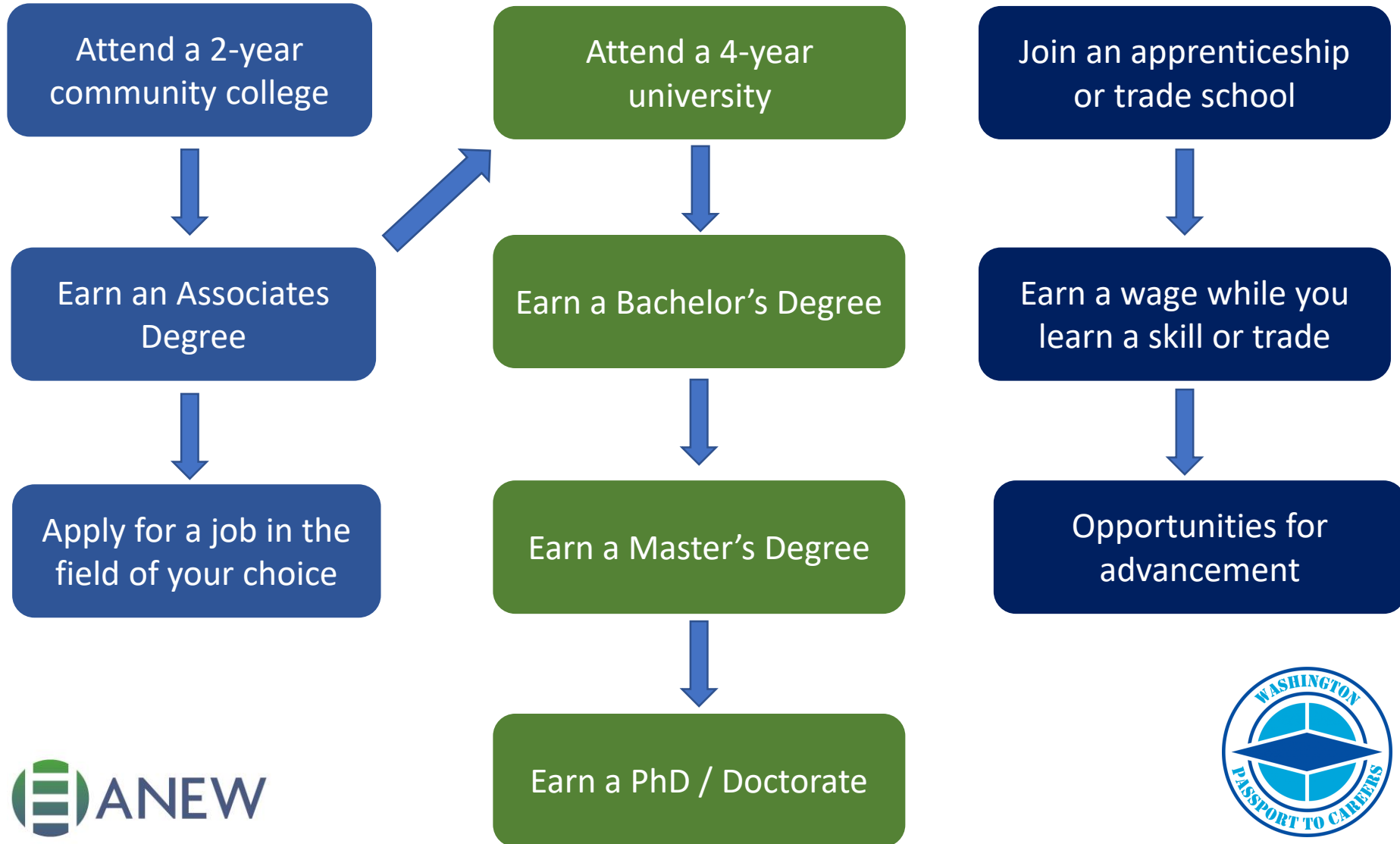
A new student is interested in IT support or computer programming.

Let's zoom in on a couple options...



UNIVERSITY *of* WASHINGTON

Spend \$26,595 for one year of college classes



Make \$45,000 as a starting apprentice,
with raises every 6 months



Implementation of Passport



Developing partnerships with schools/counselors, shelters, foster care agencies, IL/TL providers, etc.



Working with clients on case load to develop 5-year plan



Outreach: so far have reached over 723 professionals who work with potential eligible clients statewide



Workshops at IL, career fairs, high school presentations, etc.



Travel across Washington state to meet with clients, connect with partners, and hold workshops

What does ANEW offer?

Pre-Apprenticeship ...

- Short-term training
 - 11 weeks (part time or full time)
 - 4 weeks (full time)
- Un-paid training
- Develop knowledge and skills of generalized training to become competitive for a construction trade apprenticeship
- Earn certifications to become marketable and employable in the construction industry



To an Apprenticeship!

- “EARN WHILE YOU LEARN”
- On-the-job, **paid** training combined with post-secondary education
- Takes academic and technical courses called “Related Supplemental Instruction” and applies skills learned on the job under supervision of a journey-level worker.



What are the differences between a Pre-Apprenticeship & an Apprenticeship?

A Pre-Apprenticeship is ...

PREPARATION AND PRACTICE

- Short-term, UNPAID training
- Develop knowledge and skills of generalized training to become competitive for apprenticeship
- Earn certifications to become marketable and employable

An Apprenticeship is ...

“EARN WHILE YOU LEARN”

- On-the-job, paid training combined with post-secondary education
- Takes academic and technical courses called “Related Supplemental Instruction” and applies skills learned on the job under the supervision of a journey-level worker.




Have a Pre-Apprenticeship completion certificate

Be eligible for preferred or direct entry into a PAID apprenticeship

When You Graduate From Pre-Apprenticeship Training, you will...

Have a network of alumni to help with career progressing and mentoring

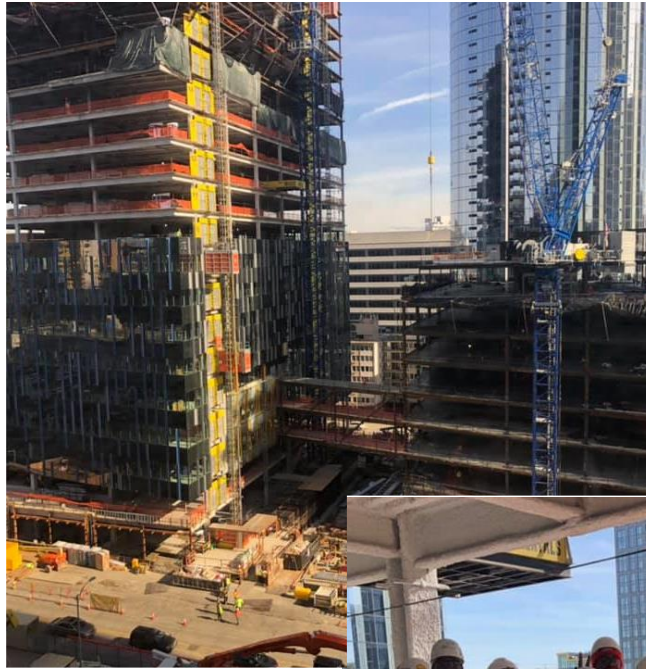

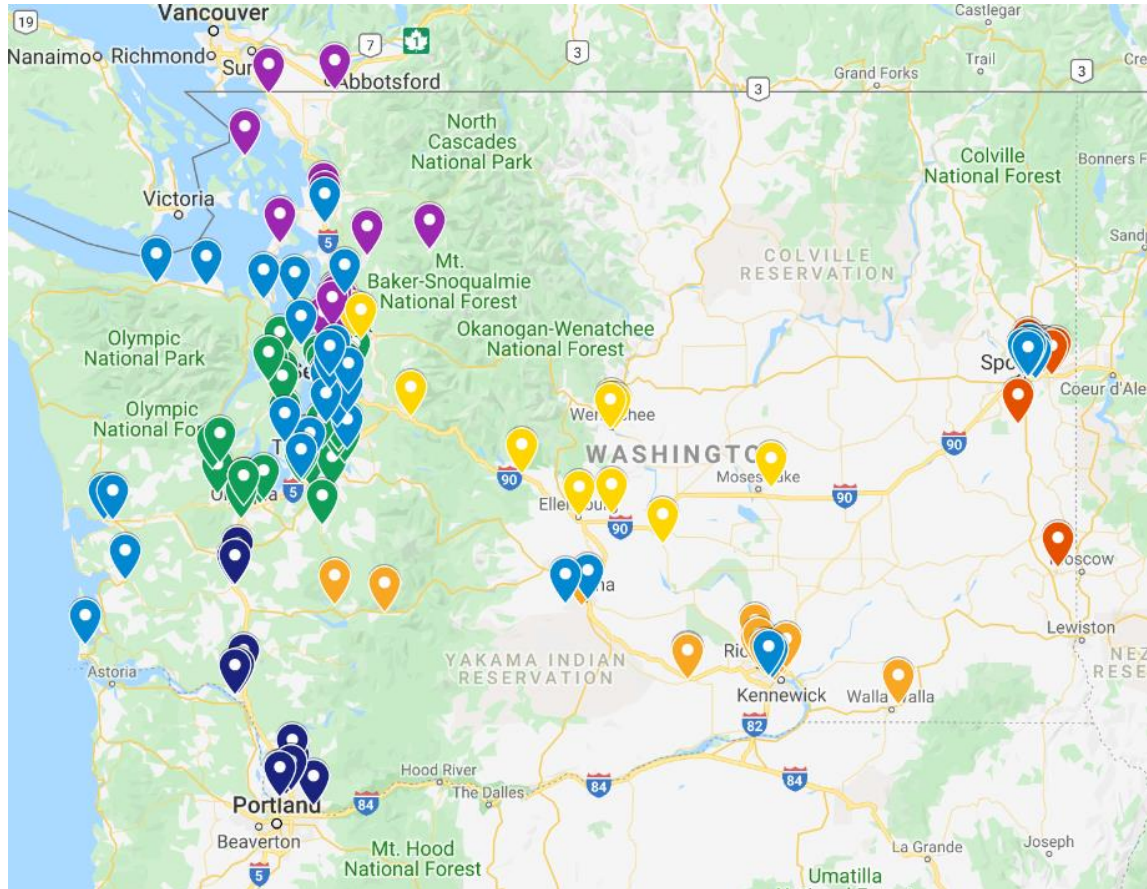
