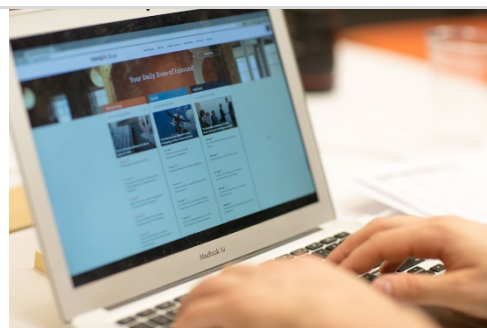
An Important Reminder

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COMMUNICATION TIPS TO SHARE FOR VIRTUAL SUCCESS

BlackboardConnect messages: Many families have students at different schools and receive several messages from different teachers. We suggest adding the name of your school in your subject line to make it easier for parents identify who you are.

District email: Along the same lines as BBC messaging, we suggest adding a signature line in your email.
