they are also serving meals to students who have returned to the classrooms--always with a smile. They are incredibly dedicated and caring and May 7 is their special day!

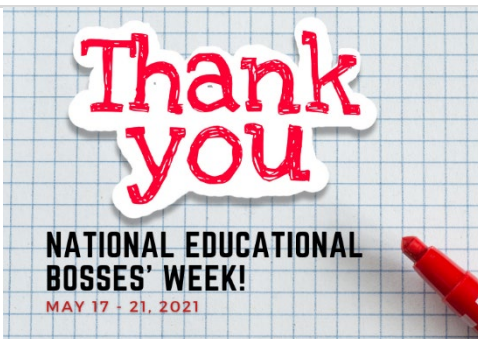

Emergency Broadband Benefit

The Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month toward broadband service for eligible families and households who are struggling to stay connected during the COVID19 pandemic. Qualifying households on Tribal lands can receive a discount of up to \$75 per month for service. Eligible households can also receive a discount of up to \$100 for the purchase of a laptop, desktop computer, or

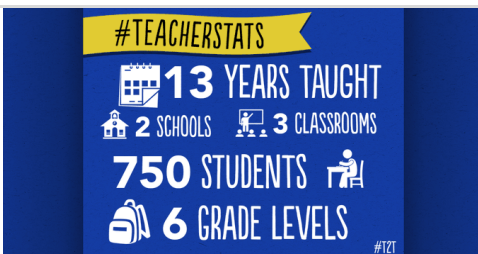
