To ensure kids stay engaged and not bored, kids that are excelling should have the opportunity to more challenging assignments

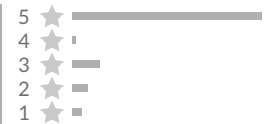

Parents need to know the expectations in order for us parents to prepare our kids emotionally for the next school year.

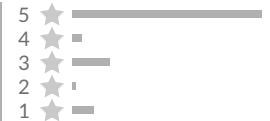

Not all parents are able to help their students understand the material being covered in class.

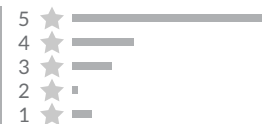

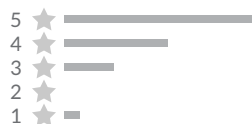


Continued interaction between teacher and parent.

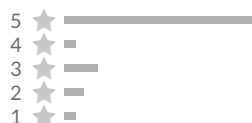


Open interest clubs, sports, after school activities etc.

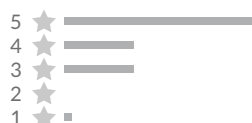


Keep expectations high and challenge students who are at or above standards, but give grace and extra support to those that need it.

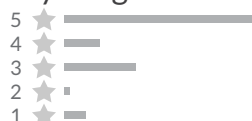


show zero interest and was sad sitting at home .she also had lack of concentration issues.I hope next year it should be in person for 5 days .
