

Graduation Procedures

Revisions are to comply with [HB 1295](#) – Students Released from Institutional Education Facilities. Students in or released from an institutional education facility (school district) must be provided with access to world language proficiency tests, American sign language proficiency tests, and general education development (GED) tests. School districts must award at least one high school credit to students upon meeting the standard established by the state board of education on a world language or American sign language proficiency test or a GED test. Additional credits may be awarded by the district if a student has completed a course or courses of study to prepare for the test. If the school district has a local policy for awarding mastery-based credit on state or local assessments, the school district must apply this policy for students in or released from an institutional education facility.

Policy 2410 and Procedure 2410P, High School Graduation Requirements

Proposed revisions to Policy 2410 are to comply with [HB 1295](#) – Students Released from Institutional Education Facilities. Revisions to Procedure 2410P include the addition of new courses and the addition of language regarding Running Start. Additional revisions comply with [SB 5299](#) regarding the use of computer science credits, and [HB 1302](#) regarding College in the High School.

Policy 3520 and Procedure 3520P, Student Fees, Fines, and Charges

Proposed revisions are to comply with [HB 1176](#) which revises “voluntary work” to “community service.” If a student is unable to pay a fine or charge, the student may make restitution through community service. Another revision includes the requirement for districts to publish and maintain specific information on the district’s website regarding withholding student diplomas for failure to pay a fine or charge.
