Dear families,

We are excited to share that Edmonds, Everett and Mukilteo school districts are partnering to provide two COVID-19 vaccination clinics for students ages 5 - 11.

Please know we only have a limited supply for each of the clinics. We are working hard to secure more doses for future COVID-19 vaccination clinics.

Families must make a separate appointment with each child's name and information. Appointments are non-transferrable. Only children with a confirmed appointment will be able to get the vaccine at that time. Walk-ins will not be accepted.

Due to high demand, families may not be able to register all of their children for an appointment at these two clinics, as we expect them to fill up quickly.
