Regarding: Additional COVID 5-11 vaccine clinics

Dear families,

We are excited to share through our partnership with Seattle Visiting Nurses, we have more first dose COVID vaccine for 5 – 11-year-olds and we will be holding two more vaccination clinics. The clinics are again a collaboration with Edmonds, Everett and Mukilteo school districts and either clinic is open to all families from these districts.

Families must make a separate appointment with each child's name and information. Appointments are non-transferrable. Only children with a confirmed appointment will be able to get the vaccine at that time. Walk-ins will not be accepted.

Due to high demand, families may not be able to register all of their children for an appointment at these two clinics, as we expect them to fill up quickly.
