District robotics teams advance to state championship

Two teams from Eisenhower Middle School will compete this February

During the first two weeks of December, FIRST LEGO League (FLL) Washington hosted regional qualifier competitions across the state. Elementary and middle school teams from Everett Public Schools participated in the competition, most competing at Evergreen Middle School on December 11 and 12.

FLL teams are made up of students in fourth through eighth grade and each team can have up to 10 students. Students are guided by two or more coaches to research a real-world problem. This year students participated in "Cargo Connect" where teams were asked to re-imagine global transportation systems and explore ways of improving how to access and deliver needed and desired goods, making all communities more connected.

Four teams were recognized for their Cargo Connect solutions and two Eisenhower Middle School teams, Eisenhower Power Programmers and Copious Coders, will be advancing to the FLL State Championship hosted by Amazon in Seattle on February 5.
