Prodigies for Peace celebrate the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. *Everett Public Schools students recognized for earning awards*

The Snohomish County Black Heritage Committee held a community celebration honoring Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and NAACP Black History Month on January 16. As part of the celebration, students were invited to submit essays and art for the 21st annual Prodigies for Peace competition.

At the February 8 school board meeting, 20 Everett Public Schools students were recognized for earning awards in the contest.

The Prodigies for Peace Writing and Art Contest helps students draw connections between the people and events that shaped the civil rights movement and the social issues that influence their lives today. The essay

question asks students to describe what they could do for others that will continue Dr. King's message of equality and justice for all.

Students who chose to enter the art category were asked to use any medium they wished to create an art piece reflecting their artistic vision of Dr. King's dream coming true in our country through their eyes.

Student work was judged by members of the community. Students earning first, second, third, and honorable mention awards in each grade band and each creative category were honored for their inspirational works. In celebration of the accomplishments of these students, a [video highlighting the artwork and essays](#) was played at the board meeting for the students, their families and teachers in attendance in-person and virtually.
