Volunteer your time to Change a Child's Life

Snohomish County Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) volunteers are appointed by a judge to advocate for a child's best interests. Volunteers work with legal and child welfare professionals, educators, and others to ensure that judges have all the information needed to make a potentially lifechanging decision for each child.
