In 2022 new rules will be made for student mental health absences at school. This is part of a recent bill: **HB 1834** - Concerning student excused absences for mental health reasons.

We are forming a youth advisory to help us. Youth will inform OSPI as we develop guidance for helping schools to excuse absences for student mental health.
