We honor and celebrate our school nurses on Wednesday, May 11


"National School Nurse Day is a day to celebrate and thank all school nurses that take care of children when they are at school!

From Assessment & Research to Transportation, Chatbot Chet is now ready for questions for all Everett Public Schools' departments.




Multi Cultural Training Tour on Saturday, June 4
