³ "Best practices" refers to best practices and strategies the district has identified that school personnel should administer before or instead of administering classroom exclusion, suspension, or expulsion to support students in meeting behavioral expectations in accordance with <u>WAC 392-400-110(1)(e)</u>.

⁴ "Prevention/intervention referral" refers to substance use prevention and intervention personnel or services available to the district, which may also include Student Assistance Program or other behavioral health supports at the district or community level.

School-based threat assessment referral" refers to district <u>Policy 3225</u> and <u>Procedure 3225P</u>.

⁶ "Civil Rights Coordinator referral" refers to district personnel designated to be responsible for monitoring and coordinating the district's compliance with state nondiscrimination laws under Chapter 28A.640 RCW and Chapter 28A.642 RCW, and Chapter 392-190 WAC.
