

Washington State History GRADUATION MET

1. **AVAILABILITY.** This course is available from the start of the school year & closes at the end of Summer. The course is open during this time 24 hours a day & 7 days a week.
2. There is **NO INSTRUCTOR** in the course nor contact for assistance.
3. **SELF-DIRECTED.** Students are personally responsible for logging-in, making progress through the 7 modules AND scoring 100% on each of the 7 module quizzes.
 - a. A **Presentation Outline** for students is provided with each module to provide guidance & prepare students for the quiz. Students should complete this guide to expedite their success!
 - b. Notes for the presentation slides are provided in BOTH **English & Spanish** and found at the beneath each presentation.
 - c. Each Quiz is a 10-question multiple-choice & true/false evaluation of the module content. Completing the Presentation Outline will ensure students are guided to the standards, concepts, & terms.
 - d. **Quizzes may be taken as many times as necessary to score 100%**
4. **COMPLETION** of this course is when a student has 100% on each module quiz
 - a. Students can check their scores & progress in the course by clicking "Grades" in the left-margin/main menu.
5. **WHEN STUDENTS ARE DONE**, they will **PRINT** their grade book and take the printed page to their enrolled school contact person.
6. **STUDENTS CAN FINISH** as fast as they like. The course can reasonably be completed in only a week, with one hour of focused study each day.
7. **THE COURSE ENDS EACH SCHOOL YEAR.**
 - a. At the end of Summer all users & their work will be deleted.
 - b. For students who do not complete the course by the end of the year, a new course is created in Fall to start each year.
 - c. It is important to understand that NO student work is saved from year-to-year.
8. **CREDIT.** Students DO NOT earn credit or a letter grade for this course that is applied to their Everett Public Schools transcript.
9. **TRANSCRIPT.** Enrolled building is responsible for entering **Washington State History MET** so it reflects on the transcript.
