






# What is postsecondary?

# Postsecondary **Options**

#### **Technical & Trade Colleges**

- 1 to 2 year programs
- Provide training for skilled, high tech workers







#### • 1 to 2 year programs

- Degrees & certificates offered academic transfer degrees,
- professional-technical degrees
- certificates of achievement.
- \*Earning an academic transfer degree similar to completing the first 2 years at a 4-year college/university.

**Community Colleges** 







#### **Four-Year Colleges & Universities**

- Typically 4-year programs offering variety of Bachelor's degrees
- A university (as opposed to a college) also offers master's degrees (M.A., M.S.) and doctorates (Ph.D.) for advanced, highly specialized study.







#### **Military Service**

- **Educational opportunities** 
  - Up to 90% tuition assistance for college courses
  - Technical training in over 200 skill areas
  - G.I. Bill-Tuition for any school



#### **Internships**

- An intern is a student undergoing supervised practical training.
- Real-life applications of the skills students learn in school.
- An internship is a way to "try on a job" before deciding on a career.

#### **Apprenticeships**

- Training program where you earn wages while learning a skilled profession in a specific field.
- Supervised by a trade professional
- Includes classroom studies and on-the-job training
- Earn a salary while you learn about your trade


# Postsecondary Options





No. UC will not consider ACT or SAT test scores for admissions decisions or the awarding of scholarships for any applicants. If you choose to submit test scores as part of your application, they may be used for course placement after you enroll.

#### What is WUE?

The Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) is a tuition-savings program that makes attending out-of-state colleges and universities more affordable for students. Through WUE, you receive a reduced tuition rate, giving you more education options for your money. Virtually all undergraduate degrees are available.





#### How does WUE work?

Participating two- and four-year public colleges and universities across the Western U.S. agree to charge out-of-state students no more than 150 percent of the institution's in-state tuition. Tuition savings may vary depending on the college or major.

The bottom line: You save big with WUE and almost always pay less than out-of-state tuition.

#### How do I get started?

Check your eligibility by home state/ territory, college and major through our online **WUE Savings Finder**. Visit wuesavingsfinder.wiche.edu or use the QR code.



Meet the college's WUE admissions requirements and deadlines.

Apply directly to the college(s) of your choice.




