	Youth Engagement Team (YET)	Ongoing case management for youth who are involved with systems (juvenile justice, DCYF, Schools, homeless system)	Youth/Young Adults, ages 12 to 21, (although focused on under 18) and experiencing homelessness or at imminent risk of homelessness	
	Human Trafficking	Outreach, support and community engagement for youth and young adults at risk of or being trafficked	Youth/Young Adults, ages 12 to 24, strongly suspected of being, or known to be, trafficked	
	U-Turn	Low-barrier access to basic needs (food, hygiene, laundry, showers,etc.) and connection to additional supports	Youth/Young Adults, ages 13-24, at-risk of or experiencing homelessness	
Young Adult Housing	Coordinated Entry	Provides assessment and support accessing Housing and Prevention resources for young adults in Snohomish County.	Young adults, ages 18-24, who are literally homeless or at imminent risk of becoming homeless (within 2 weeks)	Call: 425-259-5802, ext 114
	Snohomish Young Adult Housing program (SYAH)	Provides immediate crisis housing while young adults search for an apartment and employment. Once in housing, short term rental assistance, employment search support and case management are provided.	Literally homeless young adults,ages 18- 24, enrolled in Snohomish County Coordinated Entry (CE)	
	RRH (Rapid Rehousing)	Provide help with apartment search, ongoing casemanagement, and short term rental assistance	Literally homeless young adults (ages 18- 24) enrolled in Snohomish County Coordinated Entry (CE)	
	Journeys	Studio apartments with rental supports including assistance with rent, case management and supportive services onsite.	Literally homeless young adults, ages 18- 24, enrolled in Snohomish County Coordinated Entry (CE). Income must be less than 30% Area Median Income (AMI).	
	Onward Learning	Provides free housing and schooling for Everett Public Schools graduates at Everett Community College along with case management and other supports.	Ages 17-24 who are unaccompanied homeless youth, enrolled in the KIT program in Everett Public Schools or have been in foster care after age 13. 	T-RAP Rental Assistance Program	Emergency Rental Assistance	Young adults (ages 18-24), residents of Snohomish County. Must meet additional requirments as well through intake.	Call 425-426-5002 *Funds are temporary and will be available until they are gone*

	East BCP Shelter	Emergency Shelter that provides housing, case management, life skills, Mental Health and Substance Use services	Youth, ages 12-17, who are: literally homeless, at risk of becoming homeless, or fleeing domestic violence	For Shelter and Housing Intake, call Safe Place at 425.877.5171
	Connections Host Homes	Short term emergency housing option that provides case management, life skills, MH/CD services	Youth, ages 12-17, who are: literally homeless, at risk of becoming homeless, fleeing domestic violence	
	Transitions	Transitional living program that provides youth with housing, case management, supportive services, and referrals for individual needs.	Youth, ages 16-17, who are: literally homeless, at risk of becoming homeless, fleeing domestic violence; in state care with referral from placement desk	For housing information, call 425-259-5802, x143
Family Engagement	Family Case Management	Supports teens and their caregiver to set and reach goals, navigate family conflict, and provide resources to stabilize the teen in the family unit and prevent homelessness.	Youth, ages 12-17, in Snohomish County and their parent/caregiver experiencing family conflict	
	Way Out	Interactive seminar designed to build trust and communication between teens and their caregiver.	Youth, ages 12-18, in Snohomish County and their parent/caregiver	
	Drop In Services/Phone Line	One-on-one support with any issue a parent/caregiver needs support with - referrals, discussion around family conflict, etc.	Parents/caregivers of teens in Snohomish County	
	Parenting Classes	Informational, supportive sessions designed to increase parent/caregiver knowledge of issues that may be affecting their pre-teen/teen.	Parents/caregivers of teens in Snohomish County	
Employment	SnoCo Futures	Case Management to identify career pathways, to re-engage with high school completion or find short term training programs and/or employment.
