DID YOU KNOW there are almost 1,000 students currently enrolled in Everett Public Schools who qualify as a "Kid in Transition" (KIT)? This means they are either in foster care, unsheltered (they don't know where they will sleep tonight), doubled-up with another family because they have nowhere else to go, in a temporary shelter, living in a car, or in another unstable home situation. The holidays and cold winter months can be particularly rough on these youth and their families.


Veterans Day


