From the Principal

Parents and Families,

We are excited to introduce **Success Time**! Our students are in full swing with their classes and making great strides in their learning. We always want to be sure that each student feels they have the resources and support they need to be successful. With that said, we are creating an after-school support system that is called, '**Success Time**'.

Success Time is designed to provide students with academic support outside of the regular school day. Success Time will run Monday – Thursday after school from 3:00 to 4:00 and is facilitated by certificated teachers in the library or classroom next door. It is a day-to-day program and not meant for long-term tutoring. Students who are assigned or volunteer to attend **Success Time** may use the activity bus for transportation.

How can students attend: We are capping the daily **Success Time** participants to 25 students total.

- Students can go to the **Success Time** voluntarily as long as they sign up in the front office the day before and get a pass. It is a first come, first serve basis and we will need to cap our numbers for safety and overall attention and effectiveness.
- Teachers can assign students who need academic support. The teacher will communicate with parents the day before and receive permission to sign the student up for the additional supports for the following day.

Success Time is not meant for test re-takes, after school detention/consequences, or child-care. We want to be sure that students are in our **Success Time** program to openly receive additional assistance with various subjects and/or specific academic skills. **Success Time will start on November 7, 2022.**

Fall 2022 – SBA Test Results will be in the mail by Nov. 22, 2022.

In Fall 2022 Washington public school students in grades 3-8 and 10 took the Smarter Balanced or the Washington Access to Instruction & Measurement (WA-AIM) English Language Arts (ELA) and math tests. Students in grades 5, 8 and 11 took the Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science or WA-AIM science. These assessment results fulfill state and federal requirements to understand how districts and the state are doing in meeting all students' learning needs. They also help improve instruction.

April Musselman's 6th, 7th, and 8th grade art student portraits and shaded pumpkins are on display in the library for the month of November.



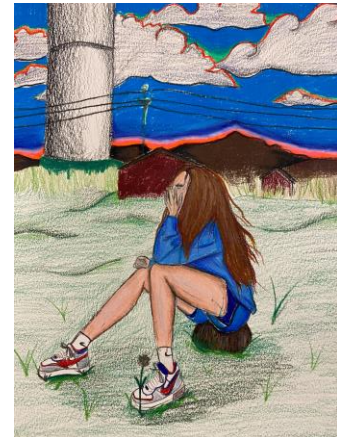
