Students recognized for Prodigies for Peace art and essays entries



The Snohomish County Black Heritage Committee held a community celebration honoring Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and NAACP Black History Month on January 15. As part of the celebration, students were invited to submit essays and art for the 22nd annual Prodigies for Peace competition.

The Prodigies for Peace Writing and Art Contest helps students draw connections between the people and the events that shaped the civil rights movement and the social

issues that influence their lives today. The essay question asks students to describe what they could do for others that will continue Dr. King's message of equality and justice for all.

Students who chose to enter the art category were asked to use any medium they wished to create an art piece reflecting their artistic vision of Dr. King's dream coming true in our country through their eyes.

Student work is judged by members of the community. Students earning first, second, third, and honorable mention awards in each grade band and each creative category are honored for their inspirational works at the community celebration.

The district regularly encourages students to submit work as part of this contest. In recent years the school board has invited honored students and their families to a board meeting in recognition of the students' accomplishments. At the March 28 school board meeting, 30 Everett Public Schools students were recognized for earning awards in the contest.
