PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

HEARD THE SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The school board heard a <u>district update</u> which included Nurses Day, Teacher Appreciation Week, Multicultural Nights, WIAA baseball and more.

SHARED BOARD COMMENTS

Director Hirman met with the Washington Family Engagement program which provides a great training program for parent leaders to learn civic engagement. Director Nicholls appreciated the recognitions in the superintendent's report and gave kudos to teachers and district nurses. He shared Emerson is having a second-grade garage sale. Director Mason shared her appreciation we have with local partners like Cocoon House and other organizations that support our students. She also thanked our teachers and nurses and told the ASB students this is their favorite presentation of the year. Student Representative Kolly shared Cascade is running the Spring Surprises this week, as well as AP testing, but that is almost over. Everyone is getting ready for graduation and are very excited. The board of directors heard proposed revisions to <u>Policy 1140</u>, Student Representation to the School Board, for a first reading with second reading and adoption to be recommended at a future board meeting. Proposed revisions clarify when student representatives may provide the board with advisory votes.

Approval of Administrative Salary Schedule 1, Administrative Salary Schedule 2, School Administrative Salary Schedule, Professional and Technical Salary Schedule, Classified Non-Represented Non-Exempt Salary Schedule, and the Certificated Non-Supervisory Salary Schedule The board discussed this topic, including a referral back to a February board meeting where they discussed salaries and that salaries remain competitive and that salary adjustments remain equitable between groups, despite the size of the group. Every employee is respected and valued at equal levels, and everyone should be included in equitable salary increases. After discussion the item was approved unanimously.
