

Legislative Youth Advisory Council extends application deadline to April 30

The Legislative Youth Advisory Council (LYAC) aims to be the voice of youth to the Washington State Legislature. LYAC create opportunities for young people to engage in the legislative process while advocating for issues that are impacting young people today.

The two-year LYAC program will accept 11+ from across the state to examine key legislation with members of both the state House and Senate, administer an annual day of action for all Washington students to lobby for change, and equip their peers with the skills to promote strong civic engagement in their communities.


Calling all high school student artists!




