


### **GREW Waiver**

### **Graduation Requirement Emergency Waiver (GREW)**

### Class of 2022

- Allows a waiver of up to two credits
  - May be flexible or core credits
  - No more than one credit in each core subject area
  - Students must earn a minimum of 20 credits to graduate
- Graduation pathways may be waived

### Class of 2023



### Class of 2024

- Allows a waiver of up to one credit
  - May be flexible or core credit
  - Students must earn at least 21 credits
- Graduation pathways <u>may</u> not be waived
- The waiver is a last resort to help students graduate after their education has been disrupted by the
  pandemic; districts may only consider the waiver after making a good faith effort to support students
  meeting all requirements.
- Districts must administer the waiver equitably and track data on the use of the waiver.
- Students receiving the waiver must also demonstrate preparation for their next steps after high school.
- Districts must advise students on the potential benefits and limitations of using the waiver; students
  planning on attending a college or university should be encouraged to contact their higher education
  institution on potential impacts.

#### **Graduation Requirements**

To graduate from high school in Everett Public Schools, each student must meet the following requirements:

Demonstrate college and career readiness through a completed high school and beyond plan

- Complete the credit and subject requirements: 24 total credits, including 17 required subject credits (4 English, 3 math, 3 science, 3 social studies, 2 health and fitness, 1 arts, and 1 career and technical education).
- Meet the requirements of at least one graduation pathway in math and in English language arts

Everett Public Schools acknowledges that circumstances may arise that prevent a student from earning all twenty-four credits required for high school graduation. Such circumstances may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- A health condition resulting in an inability to attend class
- Limited English proficiency
- Disability, regardless of whether the student has an individualized education program or a plan under Section 504 of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973
- Denial of an opportunity to retake classes or enroll in remedial classes free of charge during the first four (4) years
  of high school
- Transfer during the last two (2) years of high school from a school with different graduation requirements
- In or have been released from an institutional education facility (HB 1295)
- Other circumstances (e.g., emergency, natural disaster, trauma, personal or family crisis, or other circumstance) that directly compromised a student's ability to learn.

The board delegates to the superintendent/designee discretion to grant a waiver of a maximum of two (2) elective credits required for graduation. To graduate, students granted a waiver must earn the required credits listed above and the graduation pathway and high school and beyond plan requirements.

#### Benefits and Limitations

Students are encouraged to contact the post-secondary institutions to which they are applying to determine the potential impacts of waiving credits.
