#### **EDUCATION MATINEE TICKETS**

Education Matinees tickets are priced at **\$9 per student**. ECA appreciates the essential role of teachers and chaperones in student groups and, to this end, offers one free ticket for every 10 student tickets purchased. Additional adult tickets can be acquired at the student rate of \$9 each.

#### ARTS FOR EVERYONE PROGRAM

Schools or homeschooling families indicating a need, with an overall student participation of 30% or higher in Free and Reduced-Price Meal programs, are given priority access to **\$2 Matinee tickets** through our Arts for Everyone Program.

To apply for funding through the Arts for Everyone program or to request support for school bus transportation, visit our website and fill out our **Matinee Ticket Information Form**.

This form enables you to provide details about your school group, express interest in specific performances, state the number of students attending, and request eligibility for bus and matinee classroom scholarships.

Following your submission, a representative from the ECA Education team will contact you with confirmation of ticket allocation and scholarship status.

#### **PAYMENT**

Payment for Education Matinees can be made via cash, check, credit card, or school/district purchase order (PO), with full payment due one month prior to the performance. Reservations made within one month of the performance require immediate full payment. POs are invoiced at the time of reservation and a physical copy is required before the performance.

Kindly note that any cancellations or adjustments need to be made at least 2 weeks prior to the show to qualify for a refund or performance exchange. All changes must be confirmed by ECA.
