The school board heard the <u>superintendent's report</u> which included a curriculum adoption, AP honor roll and the end of the milk shortage.



BOARD COMMENTS

Director Mitchell shared some memories and gratefulness for Director LeSesne. She noted the passion Director LeSesne has for the arts and how it has formed much of what we have in the district today. She also shared the WSSDA conference was a very good time to welcome Director-elect Atkins and become more acquainted. Director Hirman said it has been a true honor to work with Director LeSesne. She also enjoyed WSSDA and the theme of focus and keeping the goals at the forefront and appreciated the Everett team's great presentation on cybersecurity. In addition, she attended the Monroe Elementary Instructional Review (IR). Director Mason valued the time at WSSDA and welcoming the two new board members. She shared the word "integrity" to define the 12 years of Director LeSesne's service. Director Rewolinski acknowledged he hasn't known Director LeSesne very long but could see she has been a force for good and encouraged her to continue to be that force for good. He appreciated the collaboration at the WSSDA conference.

Student Representative Gilbertson appreciated being at the WSSDA conference as well. It was a great opportunity, especially hearing Erin Jones. She shared the Everett High food drive was a great success and the Winter Wonderland is Friday December 1. She thanked Director LeSesne for being so supportive. Student Representative Kink said the WSSDA conference gave him the opportunity to network with a lot of people and appreciated the district doing well with including student voices and hope we can continue to do more. At Jackson they are decorating the school to make the last three weeks festive and support their annual food drive. He congratulated Director LeSesne for her retirement and thanked her for her positive energy. Director LeSesne thanked Brian Beckley for his cybersecurity presentation at WSSDA. She also said Erin Jones (motivational speaker) and Dana Miles (Washington teacher of the year) should be speakers at the school district.

There were two public comments. There was a parent and a student who both spoke about North Middle School lunches being too short.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Director Hirman shared the legislative update which contained information about the upcoming session which begins January 8. One topic of great interest is the capital gains tax bill which provides new funds the state will be able to keep and will be used for education. Some of these funds are intended for early learning. Other bills we anticipate include one that would advance salaries for paraeducators. There is also a bill that would require a computer class and there will be an effort to remove the special education cap as well. There are many bills of interest we will continue to watch. We cannot plan or predict any additional funds for anything until the session is over.

The board was presented a <u>brief overview</u> of how our fine arts programs help students to inspire, achieve and thrive. REVIEW MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORTS

The board was presented monthly <u>budget status</u> reports for September and October 2023. This included the most current fiscal activity by summary accounts in state form F-198. In addition to the required document, the finance department provided more detailed information on general fund (operating fund) year-to-date expenditure and revenue activity, a projected ending fund balance, a cash at County report, and an investment summary.
