



Career and Technical Education (CTE) Pathways

Planning for high school graduation starts in middle school. Students must meet one math and one English Language Arts (ELA) graduation pathway aligned with their high school and beyond plan to graduate from high school. Completing a qualifying sequence of CTE courses will meet both math and ELA requirements. The chart below lists the courses taken in middle school that qualify for a CTE Pathway.

Middle School Course	Qualifying CTE Pathway
Coordinated Science	STEM
Digital Manufacturing	Business & Marketing
Exploring Graphic Arts	Skilled & Technical Sciences
Robotics Tech I	Skilled & Technical Sciences
Robotics Tech II	Skilled & Technical Sciences
