Let's Connect on Feb. 6: Promoting Healthy Digital Habits

Let's Connect is on February 6, from 6-7 p.m. at Cascade High School, where <u>Dr. Lucía Magis-Weinberg</u>, from the University of Washington, be talking about how technology, especially social media, influences students and ways we can encourage healthy digital habits.



What to expect:

Dr. Magis-Weinberg will share insights on how digital technology shapes adolescent development. After her keynote, join small group discussions with other parents and school district leaders. These discussions will revolve around conversational prompts, making sure everyone gets a chance to share their thoughts.

To advance our understanding of how adolescent development is shaped by the risks and opportunities afforded by digital technologies, and to collaboratively explore healthy digital habits.



Applications are now being accepted for the "Ellison Education Grants". Grants are for <u>K-12 public school teachers in Washington State</u>. Over the past six years, the Ellison foundation has awarded **101 grants and \$501,000** to Washington State teachers.



Grants will range from \$1,000 to \$10,000 and be awarded this spring to be used during the 2024 – 2025 school year. Applications must be submitted by March 30, 2024.


