Everett Public Schools Commitment to Sustainability

The Board of Directors of the Everett Public Schools hereby commits the district to sustainability in decision-making, operations, programs, curriculum and culture.

In Everett Public Schools sustainability means finding a way to develop and thrive while preserving natural and manufactured resources without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. This includes the following:

Modeling for and equipping students with the knowledge, skills, behaviors, stewardship and continued learning about sustainability:

A district, school and individual-level focus on increasing the use of renewable energy, recycling, compostable packaging and reuse of materials;

Reducing the <u>amount</u> of harmful emissions we generate and the amount of water, energy and other resources we use;

An appropriate, achievable and equitable balance along with other needs in decision-making and management of our fiscal resources and consideration of sustainability implications in purchasing, sourcing and supply chain choices:

Developing a culture of collaboration, learning and partnerships around sustainability within the district as well as across the community with other school districts, agencies and companies; and

Setting expectations, establishing accountability, monitoring progress and regularly communicating status.




Decision-Making Processes

- Design according to sustainability topics
- Robust decision-making processes
- Integrate social, environmental, and economic consequences
- Transparency and collaboration







Sustainable Decision-Making for Procurement

Benefits

- Cost savings
- Reduction of waste and environmental impact
- Integration of sustainability into MSOCs
- Positive community engagement
- Improved health and well-being
- Support for local and ethical suppliers

Drawbacks

- Understanding requirements
- Human capital
- Supply chain complexity
- Cost estimation
- Upfront investment
- Consumer perception

MONITOR AND COMMUNICATE



Monitor and Communicate

- Setting expectations and establishing accountability
 - Every department knows what parameters they can work within and how best to move forward
 - At the very least, all legal and regulatory requirements must be met
 - That is not a low-bar either.
- Monitoring progress
 - State regulatory dashboards on legal requirements
 - Quarterly ask for stories to share

Communication Ideas

Things we can do to develop cheerleaders and create buy-in for the work

- Website Frequently Asked Questions
- Tell our sustainability story (ask for new information quarterly)
- Celebrate and communicate what we have already done and what we are doing
- Run a "Did you know" social media campaign around sustainability
