## NROTC PREPARATORY SCHOLARSHIPS (NPS'S)

Expands NROTC opportunities to produce a more capable and representative Naval Officer Corps.

NROTC preparatory scholarship reservations (NPSR) support that mission by partnering with educational institutions to enhance underserved or disadvantaged scholarship applicants' moral, mental, and physical foundations to prepare them for success in the NROTC program.

## PARTNER UNIVERSITY PROGRAMS

Each University has its own unique NROTC preparatory program. All universities provide scholarships for tuition, fees, room and board for the preparatory year. Upon prep year completion, the Navy NROTC scholarship supports tuition, books and fees for up to 40 months of benefits (up to 5 year total benefit)

### US Coast Guard Academy

Stipend: \$11,150/year  
Commitment: 5 years



### US Merchant Marine Academy

Founded 1943  
Tuition: Free  
Stipend: NONE  
Commitment: 5 years of MARAD-  
approved service

## SENIOR MILITARY COLLEGE BENEFITS

- Provide a military experience similar to the federal service academies like West Point, the Naval Academy, and the Air Force Academy, without having to compete for a hard-to-get slot.
- Similar schedule and experience as students at the service academies while enrolled
- A chance to earn a commission in the armed services through the Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) program
- Differences between SMCs and service academies:
  - civilian students on campus
  - go to class with traditional students attending the institution.
  - have your own dorms and dining halls and be immersed in military training, but you'll also have the chance to socialize with other students during your time at school.
