
Arab American Heritage Month


Autism Acceptance Month



Application for New CiHS Teachers and Courses in 2024-25

Everett Public Schools has established interlocal agreements with Everett Community College, Edmonds College, and the University of Washington in the High School to offer College in the High School (CiHS) for some courses taught by qualified high school teaching staff.

For the 2024-25 school year, all <u>new</u> CiHS teachers must apply using the <u>Everett Public Schools</u> <u>CiHS Application</u>. The window for applications varies based on the postsecondary institution as follows:


- Everett Community College CiHS, Application Window: March 1 June 14
- Edmonds College CiHS, Application Window: March 1 June 14
- University of Washington in the High School, Application Window: January 10 February 11 [The window has closed for the 2024-25 school year.]

To review teachers and courses already approved for CiHS, please review the <u>CiHS Approved</u> <u>Teacher List</u>. A teacher must be approved for each CiHS course. Currently approved teachers and courses do not need to be re-approved for the upcoming school year.

The **Elementary Art Show** was on display at the Community Resource Center (CRC) (3900 Broadway) from February 16 to March 28, 2024.




