Staff Scholarship Payroll Deduction Option Available

I wanted to resend Sukawt's message about payroll deduction to support the Staff Scholarship Fund and also to provide a bit more context and statement of need.

We want to give scholarships to more students. We also want to give more money to the recipients. However, based on last year's donations (only around 10-15 staff members donated) and game revenue, neither of these will be possible. In fact, the fund will continue to deplete without a change in the revenue trend.

If each staff member donated even just \$5 per month, the fund would grow and we could increase what we give each year to the students. I understand that we all have our own financial commitments to consider, and I take that very seriously. I just ask that if you can support our students in this way, please do so. Counseling Tip: The Letter of Recommendation Requests Have Started... What Do I Do???

Naviance & Letters of Recommendation

What is Naviance? Naviance is an online tool for High School & Beyond exploration and planning. Not only is Naviance used for students to explore possible career pathways, understand how they learn, create their résumé, and plan their JHS coursework, it is also the tool each high school uses to send transcripts, letters of recommendation, Common App forms, etc., to colleges.

Reminder: A student should check with you first before just assuming you'll write a letter of recommendation. Some teachers get a very large number of requests; some may not feel they know the student well enough to write a letter. We always encourage our students to practice good manners by checking with you before linking you within Naviance. Fingers crossed that they actually follow that advice!

Thanks for your patience... The Class of 2025 data is still being finalized. We are hoping it is done by the first full week of October. Until then, you won't be able to submit letters of recommendation (*which is okay, since deadlines aren't here yet!*). I'll send an update letting you know when you can start hitting the "submit" button!! 😊

Do's and Don'ts for Using ParentSquare to Communicate Promotions

As we continue to enhance our communication with staff and families through ParentSquare, it's important to clarify the guidelines regarding what can and cannot be promoted using district resources. Below are the do's and don'ts to help ensure we stay compliant with our Distribution of Information policy.

Do's:

- **Promote Events that Support Student Growth:** Information shared must contribute to the academic, vocational, or social/civil/cultural growth of our students.
- **Share Approved Fundraising Events:** You can promote events that help raise funds for the PTA and focus on student engagement. Examples include:
 - o BINGO
 - o Book Fairs
 - o Movie Nights
 - o Carnivals
 - o Festivals

Don'ts:

- **Avoid Promoting Non-Approved Fundraising Activities:** Events that do not support student-focused growth and are primarily fundraising initiatives cannot be shared using district resources. This includes:
 - o Wrapping paper sales
 - o Cookie dough sales
 - o MOD Pizza Night
 - o Amazon Smile program
 - o Entertainment Books

Security Alarms in Schools (Sonitrol)

Over the past month, district and building staff have responded to numerous alarm calls at schools during weekends and evenings caused by staff not disarming the building security system upon entry, or not re-arming the building when they are the last person to leave. When after-hour alarms are triggered, on-call maintenance supervisors, district security officers, and police are required to respond in person, costing time and money.

Beginning September 30, the district Maintenance Department will notify principals of disarm and re-arm errors and provide them with pertinent staff information so they can speak with the employee.

Keypad instructions are located next to the Sonitrol panels. If you need assistance with alarm panel operations, please reach out to [Gina Wiemann](#) during normal school day hours before you expect to need the instructions.

World Language Assessments

Everett Public Schools offers [world language testing](#) to students in grades 7-12 to provide an opportunity to earn high school credit by demonstrating fluency in reading, writing, speaking, and listening in a language other than English. Students earning the maximum credits (4) are also eligible for the Seal of Biliteracy. Students may test annually at their school in the language of their choice. Families are encouraged to register as soon as possible to allow ample time for Assessment staff to locate an appropriate language test in the language of your choice.

The registration window for the 2024-25 school year is **September 3 through October 25**. Students can pick up a registration form in C202 (Success Center).

The testing dates for JHS are **Wednesday, November 20**, and **Tuesday, December 3**; however, if there are not enough testers to justify both dates, all registered students will test on the first date.

AP Exams Are Available Online and at the ASB Office

AP exams are available for purchase. Here is the [link](#) for students to pay for their AP exams using EPS payments online. Payment is due by **Thursday, October 31**. The cost is \$99 per exam (AP Seminar & AP Research are \$147). They can also pay at the ASB office. After they have paid for the exam, students will need to log in to myap.collegeboard.org to register for the exam.

There is a \$40 per exam late order fee for exams ordered between November 1 and March 14. No exams can be ordered after March 14.

EPSF Classroom Grant Information for 2024-25

The Everett Public Schools Foundation's classroom grant opportunity is designed to amplify the district's core curriculum by funding innovative, engaging, and transformative projects that inspire learning that makes a difference for your students. Our classroom grants prioritize student excitement to learn through real world experiences. These include learning and attention tools, field trips, hands-on activities that offer students practice in creativity and critical thinking skills, encourages fitness, and celebrates music and arts.

The Foundation will make every effort to fund at least one grant per school given that an application has been submitted and aligns with the district's curriculum and LITS standards. Our goal is to spread the grants throughout the district. Our team of community volunteers reviews and scores each grant application. The total scores are ranked, and the number of grants awarded is based on Foundation dollars brought in each year.

Plan Ahead

- Applicant is responsible to **get prior approval from the principal** to confirm that it aligns with the curriculum guidelines before submitting grant.
- Applicant is responsible to **get approval** from LITS if necessary. If the grant requires a digital tools review, it must be submitted and/or approved through the LITS process located on the district website under technology equipment standards.
- Application will open on **Monday, September 16**, and will close on **Tuesday, October 22**, at 11:59 p.m.
- Grants will be awarded mid-November.

EPSF DEI Student Grant Information for 2024-25

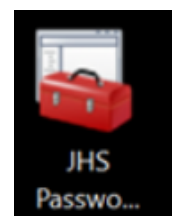

Resetting Student Passwords

This info is from Help Desk regarding students struggling with their passwords:

1. The default login for students who were enrolled from August 2022 to the present is
Username: student id
Password: two-digit birth month, dash, two-digit birth day (ex: 02-09)
2. If a student has changed their password and they do not remember it, teachers should have the tool box on their desk top that looks like this:
You (staff) will need to go into that toolbox, select the student needing help, set it to default back to their student number, and check the box that requires they change it on their next login.
