Staff Spotlight



Feature Updates in Parent Square



ParentSquare is our district's new, adopted communication

platform. It auto-translates into over 100 different languages so all our families can access information from school. Staff and families have already been invited to join, but our secondary students, grades 6-12, can join too! Encourage them to download the StudentSquare app to their phone so they can communicate with teachers and stay up to date with happenings at their school, too!

To support conference sign ups we can enable ParentSquare appointment signups at a principal's request through a help desk ticket. This feature allows for teacher's to offer appointments slots for conferences or coordinating volunteer sign ups, etc.

Al has made the creation of misinformation even easier than before. Helping students, and adults, learn to Fact Check is becoming a vital media literacy skill for everyone. The News Literacy
Project has a number of great resources for teachers and librarians who want lessons or ideas for teaching Media Literacy in their classrooms. Check out these Daily Do Now slides for 4-12 grade. They are intended to fill 5-10 min discussions or be used as bell ringers to give students small doses of media literacy practice. They update every week to give you new topics.

Google Sites

As communicated last year, Google Sites has been disabled for students by default. However, it can be enabled for students for specific instructional needs or projects. If you wish to use Google Sites with your students, please submit a helpdesk ticket. We will then ask your administrator to confirm with you the need/use case



for Google Sites, and then communicate next steps for how your students can access it. As an alternative, the district provides every student with an Adobe Express account. This service provides website drag and drop building similar to Google Sites, as well as photo editing and graphic design. Unplug'd - Teacher Control Center Options and Settings

Want tips on setting up and using your panel to make instruction more accessible to students? While we have created many panel support tips in the <u>Instructional Hardware Portal</u>, here are a few that will help you as you start the year.

Teacher Control Center:

- The Teacher Control Center controls who and when someone can share their device's screen
 to a panel. It is recommended that you set up the following <u>Teacher Control Center settings</u> to
 require authorization when sharing to the panel.
- To access the Teacher Control Center from the panel, click the Moderator Button.

Sound Settings:

 If you are having trouble hearing sounds when playing videos on your panel, here are some quick steps to modify your sound settings.

Connecting to the Panel:

- Unplug'd is the PREFERRED app to wirelessly share the screen from your device to the Boxlight Interactive Panel. Use Unplug'd to share presentations from your computer such as daily lesson slides and more! You can even show your document camera on the panel.

- ** Please note: If you want to **stream** a video to your panel, you will need to hardwire your device to your panel (i.e. from Hulu, Disney+, Amazon Prime).

Updating Lynx Software

Unlike past years, this fall you will need to install the latest version of Lynx from the Software Center (version 8.3.8.0) in order to connect your panel to your OneDrive or Google Drive folders using Lynx. You will need to do the same steps for both your district laptop and your nano device. Here are the <u>directions for updating your Lynx software</u>. Please note: The district will be pushing new Lynx firmware to your panel, so you will not need to change that device.

What's Changed this Month?

Change is the new normal in our world and we'll try to keep you updated with what's coming or what's changed this month. Keep yourself up to date so you aren't surprised by what comes next.

Canvas - Here are the changes Canvas made over the summer:

- Smart Search Al powered search for your course to help you find content
- Discussion Summaries Uses AI to summarize the highlights of class discussions in Canvas
- <u>Enhanced Rubric Maker</u> They've moved the rubric maker out of assignments to make it easier to build rubrics more centrally and make them accessible to any of your courses
- <u>Lucid</u> Canvas bought Lucid Charts and has integrated it into the Rich Content Editor and as
 an assignment option for students. There are several pre-built educational graphic organizers
 for things like Venn Diagrams, T-charts and more that can be added to your pages and
 assignments. We are waiting on an agreement from the vendor and then we'll open it up for
 student use.

Synergy - the LITS team is hard at work learning Synergy, setting up systems and working on data conversion to get ready for the Synergy launch in **July 2025**. We'll begin training various groups this spring and building training resources so we can make the transition as smooth as possible for all staff. As you can imagine, its a huge project to move all of our data to a new system and reconnect all of our services to the new tool. We'll update you here as we have milestones and important info to share.
