# **Synergy Updates**

from the October LITS Newsletter

This year the Technology Department (LITS) is deep in the middle of learning about and setting up the new Student Information System (SIS), **Synergy**, that will take the place of several tools we currently use (eSchool, Wazzle, Gradebook, TAC, Cognos, Special Programs, Performance Matters, Insight, and possibly others as we learn more) this fall. We are doing the learning now so we can begin training various stakeholder groups starting this spring.

The switch to a new SIS system will impact every part of our organization because it is our main source of student data which feeds all of our other systems such as Canvas, Clever, Panorama, GoGuardian/Class Policy, etc. This year, we are committing to learning and creating the systems which will help staff succeed in the new SIS system this coming fall. Each month in this newsletter we'll highlight some Synergy-related information to keep you updated, and coming soon will be a Synergy website where you can find regular updates and training dates as we begin to identify more details.

For now, here are some target dates for the Synergy Implementation Project (more detailed dates coming soon):

- Train the Trainer sessions now through April 2025
- Training for office staff, counselors, admin beginning in June
- Systems begin to "go live" for various stakeholder groups late July through August, side-by-side with training
- Training for teachers August LID days
- Ongoing support, office hours, and training options for all as school begins

# **Counseling Tip: Letters of Recommendation**

It's officially letter of recommendation season! With many seniors requesting letters of rec, some students ask for letters before knowing what's actually needed. I'm hoping the below info helps to save some letter writing time...

NONE of our public universities in Washington require letters of recommendation (EWU and WWU allow for a maximum of two). Most won't even accept letters of rec. And, many of our private universities don't require them either! From a quick look at where my students are applying, here's what I just pulled from Naviance:

CWU: doesn't accept letters of rec EWU: 0 minimum / 2 maximum

**Evergreen:** doesn't accept letters of rec

UW Seattle, Bothell & Tacoma: doesn't accept letters of rec

WSU: doesn't accept letters of rec WWU: 0 minimum / 2 maximum

**Cornish:** optional: 1 instructor letter of rec

Gonzaga: 1 minimum / 2 maximum

PLU: 0 minimum / 3 maximum

NW Univ.: doesn't accept letters of rec

SPU: 0 minimum / 2 maximum

Seattle U.: 1 minimum / 3 maximum UPS: 1 minimum / 3 maximum Whitman: 0 minimum / 3 maximum Whitworth: 0 minimum / 3 maximum

Hello Teachers and Staff! It is that time of year again when the new class of seniors starts their college applications, which means teachers are approached to write letters of recommendation. Often, for teachers, this is one of very few times they log in to their staff side of Naviance, and it is hard to remember the process.

I have included some FAQs for you and several resources to get you started. I am your primary contact when it comes to help with this process, so please know you are more than welcome to reach out to me if you have any difficulties or want to meet.

#### How will we receive a request to write a college letter of recommendation?

Students will submit their LOR request through their Naviance account. This notification will come to your email. When they submit their request, it will allow you to send your documents.

#### Do all colleges require letters of recommendation?

Nope! Students should only ask if the college requires it. If students are putting their request in Naviance, FIRST it tells them if the college even wants a letter of recommendation. If they do want one it tells them how many. If students ask you in person, you may want to double check that they have put the letter of recommendation request in Naviance so the student can double check if that college wants a letter.

#### How early should students put in their requests?

In the classrooms full of seniors that I have been in AND on the video for students about how to make a request, they have been told they need to submit it at least two weeks ahead of their deadline. This does not mean that they should put in the request on the day we leave for Winter Break and expect that you will send it by a January 1 due date.

#### How will I know what to write, or what to ask for from the student?

Now that we are post-COVID, we are still seeing colleges that are not requiring test scores such as the SAT/ACT and are either "test optional" or "test blind." Your letter can provide valuable insight into who our students are as a person and really highlight both their performance in your classroom and their character.

Please ask students if they have filled out their Brag Sheet Survey (2024-2025) in Naviance. This information is important for the student to complete so you have the tools you need to write the letter. I have included step-by-step instructions for how to locate this on the staff side. This will help you greatly to write a very thorough letter of recommendation for the student.

How to access the student brag sheet survey (teacher instructions)

How to complete your student brag sheet survey (video you can send to students if they did not complete it yet)

How to request a letter of recommendation in Naviance (video to send to students if they don't know how)

Teacher Letter of Recommendation – Naviance Teacher Desk Instructions (video)

#### **Basic Workflow:**

- Receive email notification of a letter of recommendation request.
- Log in to Naviance to view the details of the requests on the Teacher Desk dashboard.
- Click a request to open the Student Request page.
- From the Student Request page, follow the three steps to submit the recommendation:
  - 1. Prepare the Common App Teacher Evaluation Form.
  - 2. Upload a letter of recommendation.
  - 3. Submit your files.

### **Nominate an Amazing Teacher in Your Community!**

The Presidential Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching (PAEMST) are the Nation's highest honors for K-12 STEM educators. PAEMST is pleased to announce that the 2024-2025 nomination and application cycle for 7-12 grade teachers is now open.

PAEMST are the highest honors bestowed by the United States government specifically for K-12 science, mathematics, engineering, and technology teaching. Congress established the awards in 1983, and the President may recognize up to 110 exemplary teachers each year. The PAEMST program is administered by the National Science Foundation (NSF) on behalf of the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP).

Each PAEMST awardee receives a \$10,000 award and a commemorative Presidential certificate and joins a cadre of over 5,200 PAEMST alumni. Awardees are also invited to an awards ceremony in Washington, D.C., to participate in meetings with STEM education, research, and policy leaders.

Please consider nominating an excellent 7-12 grade educator on the <u>PAEMST website</u> today. If you are interested in applying yourself, you can begin an application at <u>www.paemst.nsf.gov</u>. This cycle's application deadline is <u>February 6, 2025</u>.
