Reminders for Semester 2

This is a good time to renew our best practices, including:

- Keep classroom windows uncovered—visibility protects teachers!
- One student per bathroom pass, please. Avoid letting students take the pass at the beginning or end of the period.
- Please don't tell students they can transfer into or out of your class. Those are decisions that can only be made in partnership between admin, families, counselors, and you.

Attendance Reminders for SEM2

When a student comes to class with an excused pass—whether from another teacher, counselor, office, health room, or attendance (yellow slip)—PLEASE mark them TE. If they have missed more than half the class they should be coming by my office, and then I will change the code to the appropriate selection. Please don't just assume I will change it; if they don't come by my office, I don't know!

This will also help for the students who come to my office trying to get their attendance excused, but then they do NOT go to class. (2)

On a separate note, please remember that if you add a time in the arrival slot and it is after 1:00 in the afternoon, you have to specify PM; otherwise, it defaults to AM. Don't ask me why, but I get notices weekly of time errors and then I have to go back and change the time to PM.

S/U Grading for Students with IEPs

As we finalize grading for SEM1, I want to remind you to review the grades for students on your rosters who are on IEPs to determine if they qualify for S/U grading.

Here are the key points to keep in mind:

- F Grades: Any F must be converted to either an S (Satisfactory) or U (Unsatisfactory). Please contact the student's case manager if you are planning to assign a U.
- D Grades: These should be evaluated on a case-by-case basis to determine if a change to S/U is appropriate. Please contact the case manager for guidance on whether or not to change.

I've attached guidelines to help you if you have any questions on whether an S or U makes sense. If you're unsure or have questions about a specific student, please don't hesitate to reach out. I'm happy to collaborate with you to ensure we're supporting each student effectively.

Immigration Enforcement Policies & Procedures FAQ

I've had staff ask some good questions about our policies and procedures. After consulting with the experts, here are the answers to what has been asked. Please keep the questions coming on this important topic so that we can know the correct thing to do should the issue ever arise here. Sechin

Q: Can we send a message to teachers/tell teachers that ICE is here?

A: We can say that there is a valid warrant. However, ICE may require us not to disclose the purpose of the warrant.

Q: Are there different rules if it is a school event but not on school grounds (e.g., graduation or a sporting event)?

A: During public events, students and families would be protected by state law but not district policy.

Q: What about public spaces (e.g., parking lots and the gym during home games)?

A: "School grounds" includes places that are private (e.g., classrooms, back offices) and places that are public (e.g., the parking lot, the front office, and the gym during games that are open to the public—but not the gym during class time or other times). Law enforcement agents would need a warrant to enter private spaces, but they **can** operate in these public spaces without a special warrant, subject to Washington State laws.

Synergy Training – Scribe

Synergy update

The LMS department is using <u>Scribe.com</u> to create step-by-step guides for **Synergy Training** in May and June.



- The Scribe Extension launches Friday, February 14—IT will push it out to all staff.
- You can access basic how-to guides without the extension, but if you sign in, you will unlock the Guidance feature.
- This is especially helpful if you are learning on a laptop or one screen.

More details about signing in will be shared closer to February 14, but you will not need it right away—only when training begins in late May. If you want to install the extension yourself, follow this guide: How to Install Scribe Extension for Chrome. Once you've installed the extension and created a district account, you can test out the Sidekick/Guide Me feature using this Scribe: How to Translate Text Using Immersive Reader.

Canva for Education Update

There has been a short delay in getting Canva for Education accounts set up for all staff and students.

Because we have both an email@everettsd.org and an ID@apps.everettsd.org account in our district, Canva recommends that we give people time to copy over any content they don't want to lose from other accounts to their @everettsd.org account.

We did not want to have that work occur during the transition between semesters.

If you have more than one Canva account, you should have received an email on **February 7** with directions explaining how to move content from one account to the other. You'll have two weeks to move content you'd like to keep, and on **February 21** we should be able to start the rostering process and create the integration in Canvas.

If you have previously been paying for the Pro version of Canva you can still choose to move content over to the free district education account or you can keep it separate and move it over before your renewal date. **The Pro version of Canva and Canva for Education are the same accounts.** The company is providing full free accounts to educators and students as a way of giving back to their community.

Nominations now open for OSPI Educator Awards

If you know someone who should be recognized, now is the time to nominate them!

- <u>Teacher of the Year</u>. Open to any certificated teacher who spends at least 50% of their time with students in a classroom setting. **Deadline to nominate: March 2.**
- <u>Classified School Employee of the Year</u>. Open to any public school classified employee working in a non-executive management position. **Deadline to nominate: March 2.**
- <u>History Teacher of the Year</u>. Open to K-12 teachers of American history (including state and local history) with at least 3 years of teaching experience. **Deadline to nominate: April 30.**

Grants for Washington State K-12 Public School Teachers!

Applications are now being accepted for the **Ellison Education Grants**. These grants are for K-12 public school teachers in Washington State. Over the past six years, the Ellison Foundation has awarded **119 grants and \$562,000** to Washington State teachers.

Grants will range from \$1,000 to \$10,000 and be awarded this spring to be used during the 2024–2025 school year. Applications must be submitted by March 30, 2025. Learn more at http://ellison-foundation.org/ellison-education.
