MTSS Survey: Lunchtime Supports

Our MTSS team has been meeting regularly to develop a strong system of supports for JHS students, particularly during unstructured times like lunch. We are exploring the creation of alternative lunchtime locations for students who would benefit from a positive environment, providing them with possible spaces to recharge and refocus during the day. This could include students who are looking for a quiet space or seeking community outside the lunchroom.

We know that some teachers already generously open their classrooms to students during lunch, and we'd like to learn more about those efforts. To help us understand where these supports exist, we've created a very short Google Form to identify teachers who currently offer this opportunity or who may be open to doing so in the future.

We want to emphasize that this is not a request or expectation to do anything outside of what you're already comfortable with. Lunch is a vital break for everyone, and no teacher is being asked to take on additional duties. This is simply a way for us to understand the current supports and see if there is any interest in expanding them. If you choose to welcome students into your classroom during lunch but need to occasionally close your door for personal reasons, we completely understand and encourage you to put a "closed for lunch" notice on your door whenever needed.

Senior Letters List!

Hello, JHS staff! It is now time for what has become an annual tradition that many of us cherish: writing staff letters to our graduating students. As fun as it is to sign yearbooks (which you can still totally do), providing these letters as part of a graduation package for each student is a nice, and meaningful, touch. So, let's do this!

If you are new, here is the basic concept: the JHS staff writes letters or cards to the graduates, and we gather them all and include them in their graduation package that they will each receive. As for details on how we keep it all organized...

I have created a spreadsheet, similar to the ones from previous years, where we keep track of all of our graduating seniors (Important note: this sheet is only for students in the Class of 2025; any other graduating students will need to be accounted for separately). The goal is to make sure that every student on this spreadsheet will be getting at least one letter in their graduation package.

First, here is the link to the spreadsheet: Senior Letters List co2025.xlsx

Second, the directions (which are also summarized on the sheet itself, in case you forget what to do):

- Scroll through the list, looking for names of students you will <u>definitely</u> write a letter to. No maybes, because we need to be sure each kid is represented.
- If you get to a student name and there is no staff member name in Column E, you can add your name. When you add your name and hit "enter," it will turn the cell white, indicating that a name is now present in the cell. Red cells are ones that still need a name. Pretty easy, right? Anyway, see the pics below (pics are from a past year, but they still work) to show how simple it is.

• If you get to a student you plan to write to and there is already a name, do nothing to the spreadsheet!! You should still write a letter to that student—just leave the spreadsheet alone, since there is already someone who has put their name. That student will get at least two letters, and that is totally fine. Some kids might only get one or two, some might get 15; the goal is just to make sure each student has at least one staff member to write to them.

If you are working in the spreadsheet and you have **any questions** about if what you are doing is correct, **please just email me.** In the past, some very well-intentioned people did not see the directions about only

having one staff name per student, so they tried adding another column and things like that, and it kinda messed up the spreadsheet. I have done my best to simplify the process and to also super-duper clarify my directions, so I am hopeful that it is all totally smooth this year.

Last detail: timelines. You can begin to drop off your letters in the main office whenever you have them done. There will be a box in the front office that is labeled "Senior Letters" and there *might* also be some supplies (blank cards, mainly) available in the coming days if you would like to use them to write your letters. Obviously, we will need them all by early June, at the latest, though we will communicate the specific deadline as it approaches. To minimize stress on our end: the sooner, the better (so, like, mid-to-late May)

Application for New CiHS Teachers & Courses for 2025-26

Everett Public Schools has established interlocal agreements with local and state colleges to offer College in the High School (CiHS) for some courses taught by qualified high school teaching staff.

For the 2025-26 school year, all new CiHS teachers must apply using the <u>Everett Public Schools CiHS</u> <u>Application</u>. The window for applications varies based on the postsecondary institution, as listed below.

Application windows:

- <u>Edmonds College</u> CiHS application window open through May 30
- Everett Community College CiHS application window through May 30
- NEW! <u>Central Washington University</u> and <u>Eastern Washington University</u> CiHS programs will also be available for the 2025-26 school year; application windows are open through May 15

To review teachers and courses already approved for CiHS, please review the <u>CiHS Approved Teacher List</u>. A teacher must be approved for each CiHS course. Currently approved teachers and courses do not need to be re-approved for the upcoming school year unless the postsecondary institution has a renewal process. 
Who? Class of 2025 students pursuing a career in Education
