Attached are two Excel documents:

The first Excel contains staff proctor and room assignments. We tried to have two to a room to provide breaks as needed, etc. Also, your room pairing should consist of a teacher who will not get their prep on a given day and one who will. Those who do not have a prep on a given day are indicated by an asterisk (and a reminder about this in the orange box as well). There are two tabs below, one for each day and proctor assignments change, so please take a look at both tabs! I know this is never perfect, but the goal was to never have anyone act as the "Test Administrator" two days in a row. The exceptions might be for the rooms with smaller numbers (ML and SpEd). Hopefully, this outlines where you should be—if you were omitted, it may have been because I do not have a record of training or you need to be in another spot. PLEASE don't hesitate to reach out if you see something in error or have any concerns.

- The second Excel are <u>student room assignments</u>. This also contains any accommodations each student
 may have. There are two tabs—the first is all students arranged alphabetically. THE SECOND TAB is the one
 that might be easier to read; these are sorted by rooms—the COLOR CODING HAS NO SIGNIFICANCE
 WHATSOEVER; I thought this would just make it easier to read and delineate each room.
 - ML AND SPED TEACHERS: I tried to separate rooms and locations based on necessary accommodations. If you feel a student is in one of these rooms in error OR there is a student not in there who should be, please let me know!

Please review these room assignments with your 10th graders on Monday—we will be posting these in various places around the upper floors where they will be testing and also near the main office.

I also reattached the <u>training PPT</u> and the <u>TA Script</u>—the TA script will also be included in your boxes along with scratch paper, test tickets, room signs, and some headphones. We will be delivering power strips on Monday. PLEASE make sure that you pick up your testing boxes from the testing room by 7:15 on the testing days, May 20 and 22.

Please send me any questions you may have, and thank you all. I know that standardized testing may not be the highlight of your year, but I appreciate everyone's teamwork and willingness to make it as painless and effective as we can for our students! I will send another email before Tuesday to review important reminders about technology, who to contact, extended testers, etc.

We assume that any senior NOT listed is on track and will pass your class. Therefore, we will only contact the families of students who are listed as at risk of failing.

Blood Drive Monday, June 2

We are going to try the blood drive one more time this year. It will be **Monday, June 2**. This time we are using the Bloodworks Northwest blood mobile, so our facilities will not be used. The blood mobile will be parked outside the main gym.

For student donors:

- They must be at least 16 years of age.
- Anyone who is 16-17 years of age must have a permission slip filled out. Those forms can be found on my door, C141, and at the scoop. They will need to bring the form with them to their appointment.

Calling 911

In the event you need to call 911 from any district building, go to the nearest phone and dial **911**—there is no need to dial 9 or 1 before dialing 911 from a district phone.

When to call 911 from school:

- Serious medical emergencies like severe injuries, seizures, or loss of consciousness
- Active shooter situations or other violent threats
- Fires or significant smoke

Key points to remember when calling 911:

- Be clear and concise: State the emergency clearly, including the location (school name and room number or location within the school).
- Identify yourself: Provide your name and role (student, teacher, staff member) if asked.
- Stay calm: Even if you are panicked, try to speak calmly and clearly to the dispatcher.
- Follow instructions: Listen carefully to the dispatcher's instructions and follow them precisely.

Please use 911 responsibly. Call only if you need an emergency response from police, fire, or medical. For non-emergencies, call the local police or fire department, or another appropriate agency. <u>Sechin</u>

Testing and Class Policy

This message is for teachers. Others can disregard.

Please be aware that Class Policy can affect students outside your classroom. When you enable it, it will default to locking down every student who is normally in your class during that time. Any students who are elsewhere for whatever reason (in this case, testing) will still be locked down when you enable it, which will interfere with their ability to use their laptop. Please be aware of this and exclude testers when enabling Class Policy. Thanks! Elizabeth Grothaus

We received a question about Gradebook access after the conversion to Synergy. Following is the answer we got from LMS. <u>Heather</u>

Our current Gradebook will **NOT** be imported into Synergy Gradebook, so having a printed copy at the end of the year will be very important.

Moving forward, Synergy Gradebook does have the ability for teachers to view past year Gradebooks. 2025-26 will be the first year in Synergy Gradebook, and teachers will be able to view 2025-26 Gradebooks when in the 2026-27 school year.

Mental Health Awareness Month Resources

Application for New CiHS Teachers & Courses for 2025-26

Everett Public Schools has established interlocal agreements with local and state colleges to offer College in the High School (CiHS) for some courses taught by qualified high school teaching staff.

For the 2025-26 school year, all new CiHS teachers must apply using the <u>Everett Public Schools CiHS</u> <u>Application</u>. The window for applications varies based on the postsecondary institution, as listed below.

Application windows:

- Edmonds College CiHS application window open through May 30
- Everett Community College CiHS application window through May 30
- NEW! <u>Central Washington University</u> and <u>Eastern Washington University</u> CiHS programs will also be available for the 2025-26 school year; application windows are open through May 15

To review teachers and courses already approved for CiHS, please review the <u>CiHS Approved Teacher List</u>. A teacher must be approved for each CiHS course. Currently approved teachers and courses do not need to be re-approved for the upcoming school year unless the postsecondary institution has a renewal process.
