### **SEM2 Final Grading Timeline & Process**

#### S/U Grading for Students with IEPs

As we get closer to the end of the year, I just wanted to send out a friendly reminder to take a moment to review Gradebook and identify any students with IEPs who may qualify for S/U grading. If the student's IEP shows S/U grading, please review their performance and update the grade accordingly. If you are unsure about how to apply this grading option, please reach out to the student's case manager for guidance.

Also, if the student still needs to demonstrate learning in specific areas before receiving a final grade (letter grade or S/U), please communicate with the student/parent and case manager. This helps to ensure that we are providing the appropriate support and clarity for everyone involved.

Please see the <u>attached doc</u> if you need a refresher on the guidelines for S/U grading. However, it's important to remember that the "I" in IEP stands for *Individualized*—each student's needs, supports, and grading accommodations may look different. Be sure to consider the unique circumstances outlined in their IEP when reviewing grades. When in doubt, connect with the student's case manager; we are here to help.

We received a question about Gradebook access after the conversion to Synergy. Following is the answer we got from LMS. <u>Heather</u>

Our current Gradebook will **NOT** be imported into Synergy Gradebook, so having a printed copy at the end of the year will be very important.

Moving forward, Synergy Gradebook does have the ability for teachers to view past year Gradebooks. 2025-26 will be the first year in Synergy Gradebook, and teachers will be able to view 2025-26 Gradebooks when in the 2026-27 school year.

We are getting closer to launching Synergy, our new student information system that will streamline how we manage grades, attendance, schedules, and student data.

Staff who have completed their basic navigation training are able to access all the other training modules directly related to their work. Preparation is underway for the training specifically for our teachers that will take place on one of the LID days in August.

The countdown is less than 30 days until we go dark on our eSchoolPlus system on June 27. Synergy goes live after July 17. Families and students will get an email in August with instructions on how to set up their accounts.
