Background and Instructions:

Consider how Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s legacy affected the civil rights and other important issues of all Americans. Take into account the principles Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. suggested in his "I Have A Dream" speech and how they may have impacted our country. How can his dream and vision of our country become your dream and vision?
