This three-day intensive program is designed to increase participants' knowledge about facilitating team building and leadership development activities. Learning will take place through information sessions, involvement in cooperative experiential activities as both a participant and a facilitator. Program participants will also have many opportunities for feedback and group discussion.

4-H Challenge leaders are individuals who work with a group of young people, presenting games and problem solving activities in a manner which is designed to develop life skills. FUN is a considerable element of this process; however, this is more than just a recreational adventure. It is an educational process. The leader facilitates a process that allows participants to learn from each other and the experience.
