## RESOLUTION NO. 289

WHEREAS, funding available to the Everett School District (the "District") in the 1981-82 school year from the State and other revenue sources is inadequate to support a 10.1% salary increase for nonsupervisory certificated employees without causing substantial reductions in the District's 1981-82 educational program; and

WHEREAS, Section 15.01B of the 1980-82 collective bargaining agreement between the District and the E.E.A. provides in pertinent part that

"The District may elect to terminate this Agreement effective as of the end of the 1980-81 school year if: . . . the District determines that the needs of the District's educational program cannot satisfactorily be met because of inadequate funding from the State and other revenue sources. The foregoing election must be made no later than July 1, 1981 by written notice to the E.E.A.";

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Directors of Everett School District no. 2 as follows:

- 1. The District hereby determines that granting the 10.1% salary increase for nonsupervisory certificated employees in 1981-82 would mean that the needs of the District's educational program could not satisfactorily be met because of inadequate funding from the State and other revenue sources.
- 2, The District hereby elects to terminate the 1980-82 collective bargaining agreement between the Everett School District and the Everett Education Association effective as of the end of the 1980-81 school year.
- 3. The Superintendent is directed to furnish written notice of the foregoing election to the Everett Education Association no later than July 1, 1981.
