School district earns over \$298,000 in PUD energy rebates

Check presented Nov. 22 represents energy retrofit incentive projects of the last year

Snohomish County Public Utility District Commission President David Aldrich handed Everett Public Schools board members a facsimile check for \$298,327.82 on Nov. 22, 2011. The funding is payment for the district's recent completion of projects that will save energy and money over the years. The projects include installing energy efficient lighting, heating equipment upgrades, energy management system upgrades and improved insulation on roofing replacement projects.



According to the PUD, the district will save approximately \$100,000 a year in energy costs because of these energy project upgrades.

Mary Smith, PUD Senior Manager of Energy Efficiency notes, "Conservation is the PUD's least expensive and greenest energy source since it is energy that never needs to be generated. The PUD applauds Everett Public Schools' initiatives and investments to manage their energy costs, and we plan to continue working together to acquire all cost-effective energy efficiency."
