# **AS A REMINDER:**

- 1. Contact the <u>School Assessment Coordinator</u> (SAC) if you need additional materials.
- 2. Keep drafts for your instructional use. Only include them in the booklet if the student was not able to finish and you want the draft scored.
- 3. Score sheets will be provided on scoring day. If you would like 4x4 worksheets for student reference, they are on DocuShare.
- 4. Return the Writing booklets, <u>alphabetized by section/period</u>, to the SAC on or before the last day of testing.

### Writing Assessment Teacher Guide

**Purpose:** The purpose of the assessment is to determine each student's ability to demonstrate skill in the assessed targets and to inform upcoming instruction.

#### Please note:

- Just like the state assessment, writing is untimed. Most students will need 2-3 days to complete the assessment. Students may NOT take the assessments out of the classroom unless supervised.
- No pre-teaching, coaching, or feedback on drafts is allowed.
- For mid-year assessment only, it is up to teacher discretion whether mid-year assessments are used for a classroom grade.

#### **Prior to testing:**

- Instruct students to bring materials for independent work/reading on the assessment days.
- Read the student packet and prompt before administering the test.
- Verify that you have a Student Packet for each student.
- Have scratch paper available for any students who do not have notebook paper with them.
- Have several dictionaries and thesauri readily available.
- Confirm with your SAC which students on IEPs are testing in your room.
- Prepare accommodations for students according to their IEPs, such as computers or other electronic devices, if they are testing in your room.

#### **Testing:**

## **Remind students that they should:**

- remain seated throughout the assessment period.
- work quietly or read independently when finished with the assessment.

Distribute Student Packets and make certain each student has writing utensils.

- Fill in Name and class information on the front test booklet
- Read directions to the students
- Review the "Scoring Criteria for the Writing Task" checklist.
- Remind students to write their draft on scratch paper; the final will be written in the booklet.
- Show students where the dictionaries and thesauri are for their use
- Read the prompt aloud
  - Answer any questions about the prompt.
  - o Explain a word if anyone asks. Remember that this is a test of writing ability, not reading.
  - o Remind students that they need to fit their final text within the space given in the student packet.

<u>Test Security:</u> This is a secure test, collect student packets and drafts at the end of each period.

#### After testing:

- 1. Place Student Packets (test booklets) alphabetized by section/period in the envelope and labeled with teacher name, grade level and period.
- 2. Return testing materials to your School Assessment Coordinator (SAC)

**NOTE:** If a student's IEP includes computer access you will need to disable grammar-check:

- 1. Go to Tools/Options/Spelling and Grammar.
- 2. Under Grammar, uncheck the first box Check grammar as you type.
- 3. Remember to go back and change the settings later.
