Links and Alliances Conference Oct. 20 at EvCC

EVERETT, Wash. – Everett Community College is hosting the 16th annual Links and Alliances Conference Oct. 20 for and about lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning youth and allies.

The conference is for youth, parents, educators and the community. The event is 10 a.m.-8 p.m. at EvCC's Student Fitness Center, 2206 Tower St.

The cost is \$25 for adults (including meals and an evening performance). For youth age 14-20, attendance is free.

The conference will include workshops about coming out, building positive relationships, bullying, staying healthy and supporting LGBTQ youth. Continuing Education Units (CEUs) are available for this event.

The keynote speaker is Cheryl Kilodavis, author of "My Princess Boy," a book about acceptance inspired by her younger son's love of the color pink, sparkly dresses and other pretty things.

Kilodavis was inspired to write the book during her own process of accepting her son's interest and passions and used it to help her son's teachers and fellow students better understand him. She hopes the book will become part of a movement of acceptance for every child who has ever felt left out or misunderstood just because they're different. Kilodavis will speak 12:45-2:30 p.m.

The conference will also include a presentation by the Seattle-based Bent Writing Institute, which promotes and encourages writing and spoken word by the LGBTQ community
