CLINICIAN, John Sanders teaches music theory and serves as department chair at Edmonds Community College. As a pianist, John Sanders played for prominent educators such as Dave Barduhn at Mount Hood Community College and John Moawad at Central Washington University. He works regularly in the Puget Sound area as a pianist, accordionist, composer and arranger.

CLINICIAN, Jim Sisko Jim received his MM in Trumpet Performance from CWU and served there as a teaching assistant in Trumpet, Jazz Improvisation and History. Jim has performed with The Seattle Symphony, and has served as the principal trumpet for the Yakima Symphony. He has performed with The Glenn Miller Orchestra, Natalie Cole, Barry Manilow, and The Manhattan Transfer. Jim is currently the Director of Jazz for the Northwest School.

CLINICIAN, Brian Kirk is the Instructor of Jazz and Music Theory, and Electronic Music Composition at Seattle Central Community College. He has performed with Dizzy Gillespie, Jack McDuff, The Count Basie Orchestra, Bobby Hutcherson, and Gladys Knight. Kirk has performed on Broadway in Ain't Misbehavin, Five Guys Named Moe, Fiddler on the Roof and Les Miserables. Kirk currently is presented in various music ensembles around the Puget Sound Region, in shows, festivals, and night clubs.
