These nine inductees represent the rich history of Bruin Athletics ideals and successes on the fields, courts, and tracks of Cascade High School. Their reign at Cascade spans the five decades of *Bruin Pride*, from Jeff Cushman and Lou Stevenson of the first days on the new Cascade campus in the early 1960's to the mid 2000's for the six state championships of Whitney Hooks.

"The School of Pride" honored these Cascade coaching and athletic legends during a ceremony between the Cascade versus Everett boys and girls varsity basketball games on Nov. 30 at the Reg Scodeller Gymnasium, Cascade High School.

This year's honorees were nominated by the community and selected by the Hall of Fame Committee whose members include former and current coaches, administrators, teachers, and students. Those selected for the Coaches Hall of Fame demonstrated a continued commitment and promotion of the values and philosophy of sportsmanship including fairness, dedication, perseverance, winning without boasting and losing without excuse.
